We are celebrating the Independence Day of Lithuania despite the fact that Lithuania is not independent at the moment. But, in the words of the late President of the United States, F. D. Roosevelt, "Lithuania's independence has only temporarily been put aside..."

The tidal mud of aggressive communism has not yet receded from Lithuania. However, no state on this side of the Iron Curtain and no international body has legalized the unilateral incorporation of Lithuania into the Soviet Union.

On this Independence Day of Lithuania we are concentrating our thoughts upon the principles of state sovereignty and independence, respect for sovereign state rights, non intervention in the internal affairs of others, and of disregard of these principles.

The Soviet Union had treaties and pacts in these respects with Lithuania and her other neighbor states. The Soviet Union reassured them, not once but many times, that their sovereign rights, territorial integrity, and internal affairs would be respected and even defended.

What has happened and is currently happening in Hungary, has already happened in Lithuania in 1941 and in the years immediately after the war, when the Soviet Union occupied those states for the second time.

people and human rights. "We try to dramatize the practical things that people can do to promote understanding and realization of those ideals."

The big promotion during Brotherhood Week, according to Dr. Clinchy, will be to urge people to do more than give the principles of brotherhood mere lip service.

"We hope that during Brotherhood Week people will begin to get to know and appreciate each other—to make Brotherhood a year round practice."

FACTS ABOUT RADIO FREE EUROPE AND THE CRUSADE FOR FREEDOM

What is Radio Free Europe?

Radio Free Europe is a network of 29 powerful transmitters and relay stations located in West Germany and Portugal. It broadcasts news from the free world to the five key satellite countries of Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Romania and Bulgaria—behind the Iron Curtain—for as much as 20 hours a day.

What is the Crusade for Freedom?

Crusade for Freedom is the agency through which millions of Americans support Radio Free Europe by their voluntary contributions.

What are their purposes?

In the five captive countries behind the Iron Curtain live 70 million people whose freedoms were taken away from them by the Soviet Communists after the last war.

They need a continuing flow of unbiased news and truth to form sound judgments in their struggle to win more concessions from their Communist regimes, and to avoid wanton bloodshed.

What kind of programs are broadcast?

In addition to hourly news broadcasts of world events—including news about the countries behind the Iron Curtain—Radio Free Europe programs include commentaries, satire, entertainment, religious programs and national music generally suppressed by the Communists.

Who broadcasts over Radio Free Europe?

Respected escapees from behind the Iron Curtain—editors, entertainers, teachers, clergymen and statesmen. Poles speak to Poles in their own tongue, Czechs to Czechs, Hungarians to Hungarians.

How does Radio Free Europe get its Iron Curtain news?

From interviews by Radio Free Europe correspondents with refugees and tourists from behind the Iron Curtain, from touring athletes, from letters, from listening every day to broadcasts from 50 Communist radio stations, and from reading from behind the Iron Curtain.
