According to a United Press dispatch, Mr. Bahe, who is 71 and useless, in a recent address at the annual meeting of a Canadian mining company of which he is president, denounced "professional isolationists" in this country, for being "simply after the votes of parents who do not want their sons to go to war," and stated that we should back the Allies "if for no other reason than that of good business." This is a forthright remark, and should be

widely broadcast.

Americans Ask Release Of Friedrich Wolf

Los Angeles, Cal. — As part of a countrywide campaign to get Friedrich Wolf, sister of Professor Mamlock, out of a French concentration camp, Hollywood writers, directors and actors this week wired the French ambassador in Washington.

"News that Friedrich Wolf, world's most celebrated foe of Hitlerism, held in French concentration camp, profoundly shocked France; we are told, is fighting Hitler to preserve the democratic ideals and cultural heritage upon which its great tradition of liberty and freedom was founded.

"Friedrich Wolf fought and was willing to continue to fight Hitler, Wolf's film, Professor Mamlock, was claimed the credit ever as the most dramatic indictment of Nazism ever shown. Why then is the great writer held in a concentration camp where illness, inadequate food, clothing and shelter threaten his very life?"

"We, the undersigned writers, actors and film directors of America would point you with interest and sympathy to the fact that our faith in French democracy can be reaffirmed with the announcement that Friedrich Wolf has been released."
