Rezignavo  
Demokratai susipėše  
Sapnas

Pereitame kare labai daug plepėjo apie Tautų Lygą. Tikėjosi, kad ji suorganizuos ir suharmonizuos buržuazines valstybes ir padarys tvarką, kur laivo ejašosa.

Dabar daugelis gieda apie Europos Jungtines Valstybes. Vėl laukia stebuklo. Nieko iš to nebus, nes buržuazius negalima paversti nekaltais erikuais.

"Vilnės" jubiliejinio numerio 24 pusapiai jau gatyvi. Daug raštų, daug sveikintinų, daug skelbimų.

Su sveikinimais jau gražiai pasirodė Wautkegan, Ill. Kenosha, Wis., Elizabeth, N. J., Detroit, Cleveland ir Portland-Oregon City. O Chicago užvis geriausia.

Literatūros Draugijos 19 kp. (Chicago) sveikinimais sukėlė, rodosi, šuklę.

Nekaip jausiesi, drauge vilnieji, jei "Vilnės" jubiliejiniam numerij nebus tavo sveikinimo. Atsiminkit, kad "Vilnės" Jubiliejus ne kokia reguliarė šventė.

Tai Olimpas dvidešimties metų darbo. Skubėkit su sveikinimais.

Turū pasakyt, kad raštų turime labai daug.

Nervai ir niežai apėmė Daladiero valdžią. Dar užvakar jis žaibavo drąsiais žodžiais, o vakar jau rezignavo. Prasideda vidurių sujūrimas.

Chamberlainas dar drąsinaisi, bet jo užfrontis neturi to vieningumo, kokio jis norėtų.

Illinois valstijos demokratų vadai labai pikti susinivėjo savitarpj. Tik lyra tokie epitetai, kaip diktatoriniai, sukčiai, tironai, smarvė. Gubernatorius Horner kaltina savo leitenantį Stelle, kad nuo jo dvokia žibalinis skandalais.

Kada politikieriai susipešo, ger žmonės išgrįsta dang teisybės.

Amerikos Komunistų Partijos konvencija prasidės gegužės 30 dienų ir tęsis iki 2 d. birželio.

Ruošiantis prie konvencijos pradėta leisti "Party News". Pirmas leidinys labai turiningas.

Partijoj — vienybė ir susiklausymas. Ji auga. Tie kurie pranašavo pakrikimą, patys trinka.

"Jau saulelė vėl atkoptama budina svieta ir žiemos šaltus trisus pragraudama juokias". Taip Kristijonas Duonelaitis rašė apie prisiartinantį pavasarį.

Siemet suėna 160 metų, kaip K. Duonelaitis mirė. Jis praleido savo gyvenimą Prūsų Lietuvoj, netoli nuo Gumbinės.

Kraštus, kuriame jis augo ir veikė, perdėm susveikėjo.

Vokiečiai ir lenkai, jų aukštoji kleso ir valdžios, daug tikrų lietuviškų žemių suvokietino ir sulenkino. Su rusų tauta lietuvių santykiai susidėjo geriau. Iš tos pusės skriaudoms nebuvo, nors carizmas ir varė rusinimo propagandą.

Indijos Nacionalistų vadas Gandhi daugiasiai maitinasi ožkos pienu. Matyt, tas daro savitškos įtakos jo smegenij. Ožkos pienas prastas stimulan-

## FRANCIJOS MINISTERIŲ KABINETAS GRIUVO

### Negavo Parlamente Pasitikėjimo, Premieras Prigautas

Paryžius, kovo 20. — Francijos ministerių kabinetas rezignavo. Prezidentas Lebrun pasiūkė Paul Renaud sudaryti naują kabinetą. Renaud sutiko pasitarti su kitais ir stengis sudaryti ministeriją.

Premieras Daladier tikėjosi gauti pasitikėjimo, bet jis prigautas gudresnį politikierų. Jis norėjo ministerijoj perorganizuot, bet tikėjosi gauti pasitikėjimą, tai pats būtų kai kuriuos ministerius prašalinęs, o kitus pasilikęs, bet išėjo kitaip. Balsavo už ir vienas prieš, o 300 atstovų susilaukė. Tas parodė kiek mažai pritaręjį parlamentė turi Daladier. Jis tuomet buvo priverstas rezignuoti.

Renaud pirmiaus buvo griežtas anti-nazis, kokių ministerij jis sudarys, jei jam pasiseks sudaryti, kol kas nežina.

Smugis Vyriausybei.

Vakar prasidėjo byla 41 komunistų parlamento narių, kurių laicai tik 35 buvo teismabuty, kiti nesumiti.

Byla bus didelė ir svarbi. Komunistai kaltinami žygausose "prieš savo šalies reikalus", nes jie reikalavo taikos.

Išmetimas jų iš parlamento ir suėmimas buvo reikalingsas Daladiero vyriausybei, kad uždarytų li burną opozicijai. Bet kaip tik su pradžia bylos grūvo ir Daladiero ministerija.

Norėjo "Sudeginti Tiltus".

Parlamento sesijoj, kurioj Daladier aiškino savo politiką, kilo klausimas, dėlko Anglija ir Francija nesimėtė Suomijon armijoj. Daladier atsakė, kad pati didžioji klūtis tam buvus ne švedija ar Norvegija, bet Anglijos vyriausybės pasipriešinimas "visai sudeginti tiltus" su Sovietų Sąjunga.

Anglai manę, kad busią galima susikaltėti, bent neutralizuoti SSSR kare su Vokietija.

### Grasina Neutralėm Šalim Smerkia Kriitikus Amerikoje

Londonas, kovo 20. — Karo ministeris Oliver Stanley pagrasino neutralėm šalim, kad prieš jų bus pavartota "nazių metodai", jei jos nerems Anglijos.

Amerika irgi sykiu "perspėta", taipji jis pasmerkė tuos, kurie Amerikoj kritikuoja Angliją.

### ANGLIJOS BUDŽETAS BUS 10 BILIONŲ DOLERIŲ.

Londonas. — Balandžio 23 vyriausybė paskelbė šalies budžetą \$10,000,000,000. Karas suėda kasdien po \$31,000,000.

### LIGOS GRESIA PAVOJUM LENKIJOSJE.

Geneva. — Ir vokiečiai ir lenkai labai susirupinę kaip apsiginti nuo ligų kada Lenkijoj prasidės paleidimas. Karas paliko daug dalykų pavojingų sveikatai. Atsilius gali ligos prasidėti.



Scena prie Willow Grove angliakasyklų St. Clairsville, Ohio, kur įvyko baisi eksplozija ir užgriuvo 200 mainierių, 19 lavonų jau išmėta. Dar yra užgriutu 52. Jų likimas nežinomas.

## Milionas Kinų Veikia už Japonų Fronto Linijos

Pekinas, kovo 20. — Japonijos karo štabas pripažysta, jog šiandien Kinijoj ir po pustrėio metu karu vis dar yra daugiau milijono kinų reguliariės armijos, kurios dalys veikia, puldinėja japonus šen ir ten.

Ta kariuomenė dalinasi sekmniai: Centralinės valdžios, kuri dabar vadovaujta visom jėgom prieš Japoniją.

Pirmiaus buvusi provincinėse armijos. Komunistų kariuomenės pulkai.

Buriai tu armijų dažnai užpuola japonus iš už pečių ir smarkiai apmuša. Kai kada susiremia tvirtu frontu, bet dažniausia kinai vartoja partizaninę karo būdą (užpildindami netyčia ir sumušus vėl pasidėpia).

## Buvusieji Pasmerkti Pragaran, Dabar Išvaduoti

Cleveland, Ohio, kovo 20 d. — Apie 1,500 Ispanujotaus bažnyčios parapijony, kuriuos vyskupas Schrems buvo pasmerkęs pragaran, jau neturės ten degtis, nes vyskupas atšaukė prakaisimą, kai parapijoniai sutiko priimti bile kunigą, kurį vyskupas skirs. Jis jiems atleido tu bausių grieką, kada jie sutiko klausyti jo.

## Anglija Uždarė Kelius Amerikos Aliejui Europon

Londonas, kovo 20. — Rinkta po rinkai Amerikai Europoj uždaroma.

Anglijos ekonominio karo ministeris Cross paskelbė, kad Anglija sulaukė pervažimo Amerikos aliejaus Belgijai, Olandijai ir Danijai, nes iš tu šalij Vokietija gaunanti aliejaus.

Anglija blokadaus toms šalims aliejaus pristatymą.

## NAUJAS KINU REZIMAS, JAPONŲ ĮRANKIS.

Nanking. — Su kovo 30 pradėta veikti nauja Kinijos valdžia, kuri bus Japonijos užimtoje teritorijoj ir bus japonų įrankis. Kinai jos neprisiima.

## Vokietija Gelbėjo Finams, Sako Švedų Davinia

Stockholm, kovo 20. — Millitarijai raiteliai čia sako, kad Vokietijos valdžia ne tik netrukdis Suomijai liuosnorių ir ginklų siųsti, bet dar pati daug ginklų ir amunicijos siuntis.

Vokietija pristatė Suomijai veiktis artilleriją ir kulkosvaldžius. Siūsta ginklai daugiamisiai atimti iš Lenkijos.

Artillerija gaminta Švedijoj ir parhota Lenkijai pirma karo.

## 14,000 Lenkų Vyks Gyvent Sovietų Sąjungen

Krakovas, kovo 20. — Vokietijos valdžia sutiko išleisti 14,000 lenkų ir ukrainiečių, apleidus lenkų savo tėvishes laike karo, grąžinti atgal. Dabar jų namai yra Sovietų teritorijoj.

## Armijos Cyfai Tardomi Kongreso del Orlaivių Pardavimo

Washingtonas, kovo 20 d. — Armijos ir karo departamento aukštieji viršininkai tardomi kongreso komisijos apie Amerikos nusistatytą pardavojime orlaivių kitom šalim.

Kalbama, kad pardundant Amerikos orlaivius sykiu išduodama ir svarbius militarines slaptības. Bet prezidentas Rooseveltas pareiškė, kad nieko panašaus nėra.

## Anglija Norejus Pulti Vokiečios iš Skandinavijų

Berlynas, kovo 20. — Vokiečių orlaiviai, bombarduodantį Scapa vandensje Anglijos karo laivus išardę planą pervažinti į Skandinaviją 100,000 karių, iš kur jie būtų puolę Vokietiją.

Tie skelbia 50,000 armijos neva siųsti Suomijon būvo taikomi įsibrovimui Švedijon, o iš ten atakuoti Vokietiją, sako vokiečių spauda.

## DEVYNI COLIAI SNIEGO.

Montreal. — Quebeco provincija turėjus dvi aršiausias pugas, Nukrito 9 coliai sniego ir sulaukta visas trafikas.

## Indijos Kongreso Galva Prieš Rėmimą Anglijos

Ramgarh, kovo 20. — Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, prezidentas visos Indijos Kongreso, rusciai pasmerkė Britanijos imperializimą savo prakalboj atdarant kongreso plenumo mitingą.

Indijos Kongresas yra visos šalies politinė partija, pati galinčiausia Indijoj. Tulstanciai delegatų iš visos šalies klausėsi Azado atakų ant britų imperializmo.

Azad yra musulmanas, tai pirmas Kongreso prezidentas musulmanas nuo 1932 metų. Tas rodo vienybę indusų ir musulmanų, nežinurint kurstymo religinij riaušij.

Azad pareiškė, kad Indija neturi reikalo remti Anglijos karą.

## SUOMIJOJ STOKA MAISTO.

Londonas. — Iš Helsinkio praneša, kad ten maisto pirkinas, apribotas, nustatyta racionas, nes maisto didelė stoka.

## "Yankių Imperializmas" Planuoja Meksikoj Sukilimus

Meksikos Miestas, kovo 20. — Meksikos Komunistų Partijos suvažiavime pareiškė, jog Amerikos imperialistai nori panaudoti gen. Juan Almazan, prezidentinį kandidatą "nepriklausomumui tikietui", savo sklymas nuvertinti Meksikos liaudies valdžios ir įkurti sau prielankios.

## Vokiečiai Pripažysta Angly Atakas, Tik Ne Laimejimus

Berlynas, kovo 20. — Čia pripažystama, kad angly orlaiviai atakavo Vokietijos bazę salij Sylt, apie 7 valandas, bet užgrieko, kad bombardavimas pavykęs.

Vokiečiai sako, kad tik vienas namas bombom sudaužytas. Taipgi sako, vienas angly orlaivis numuštas.

Daugiausia bombų nukritę vanden'.

## SOVIETAI PRIEŠINAS SUOMIJOS IS SKANDINAVŲ SAJUNGAJ, NES TAI PANEIGIA TAIKOS SUTARTI

### Vokietijos Ambasadorius Skubinasi Maskvon; Vokiečiai Ragina Italiją Pirktis Aliejaus iš Sovietų

#### MASKVOS DIPLOMATŲ RAITELIAI SMARKIAI VEIKIA.

Vokietijos ambasadorius von Schulenberg atsiskubino čia ir tuojau nuėjo pas SSSR premjerą Molotovą.

Sovietų ambasadorius Berlyne, Aleksander Švarcevo, parėkia su svarbiomis žiniomis.

Londono daviniai sako, jog Churchill deda pastangas suartinti Londoną su Maskva.

Anglai mano, kad po Suomijos karui Suomija politika pasidarė dar nepriklausomesnė ir yra prog santikius pagerinti. Vokiečiai bijo, kad SSSR neatsisuktų prieš juos.

Maskva, kovo 20. — Sovietų Sąjungon priesąjus Suomijos ir Švedijos su Norvegija sąjunga, sako Sovietų žinių agentija Tass.

Tokia sąjunga paneigia SSSR su Suomija taikos sutartį, taipgi tai atsuktą prieš Sovietų Sąjungon.

Tass narodo, kad ir Norvegijos parlamentas pripažino, jog tokia sąjunga būtų vyriausia atkreipta prieš SSSR.

Šešiasparnis 3-1-1 Sovietų sutarties su Suomija, kuri pasirašyta kovo 12, sako, kad sulgyti sutarčiai nė Suomija, nė Sovietai negali daryti sąjungs ar stoti į koalicijas viena prieš kitą.

Užtvirtinta. Sovietų Sąjungos parlamentas vakar užtvirtino sutartį.

Suomijos delegatai Juho Paasilinij ir Vaino Väinöläna atvyko į Maskvą formaliai apsimainyti pasirašytom ir užtvirtintom sutartim.

## Nauji Griuvimai Trukdo Atkasimą Užgriutu Mainierių

St. Clairsville, Ohio, kovo 20. — Prastas oras ir nauji griuvimai Willow Grove kasykloje trukdo atkasimą dar iki šiol po žeme esančių 52 angliakasyklų, kuriuos gyvus rasit jau heliko vilities.

Užgriuvimas įvyko po gaso ar anglies dulkių didelės eksplozijos tose kasyklose.

Jau išmėta 19 lavonų. Da žuvo leidžiamiesi gelbėti užgriutus.

## Teismas Sulaukė Gubernatorių, WPA Projektas Pradėjo Dirbti

Vinita, Okla., kovo 20. — Fėderalis teismas išdėvė drausnį prieš Oklahomą gubernatorių Phillips, kuris milijonius pagelba sulaukė \$20,000,000 WPA projekto, reikalaujantis iš federatės valdžios atlyginimo.

Tarymas įvyks pirmądienį, iki bus nuspręsta, gubernatorius neturi teisės trukdyti projekto darbom.

## NUSKENDOM LAIVAS.

Amsterdam. — Olandijos prekinis laivas Phobos, 7,412 tonų, nuskeno užėjęs ant minų. Jo įgulys 7 žmonės nuskeno, o kiti apie 40 išgelbėta.

Oslo. — Norvegijos vyriausybė sako manius, kad Sovietų Sąjungon nesipriešins Skandinavij ir Suomijos sąjungai, nes ji yra tik apsigynimui, bet vos prasdėjus kaibom apie sutartį, jau aiškiai pasakytą, kad tai busią prieš SSSR nukreipta. Kalbėta, kad Suomija jau budavoja naujus tvirtoves Sovietų pasienyje, nors šalyje stoka maisto ir svarbiausia aprūpinti nuo karo nukentėjusius, kurių yra nemažai.

Berlynas, kovo 20. — Vokietijos ambasadorius Sovietų Sąjungon Werner von Schulenberg nusiskubino Maskvon orlaiviu. Jis stengis pasikviesti ką nors iš SSSR valdžios žymių žmonių ir Berlyną. Norima tuojau žinoti, kaip Sovietai žiuri į Hitlerio su Mussolini susitarimą ir pastangas įtraukti nau blokans Sovietus.

Vyriausės nazių organas "Voelkischer Beobachter" pritaria tokiam blokui.

Iš Londono gauta žinių, kad Winston Churchill dėsiąs pastangas patraukti Sovietų Sąjungon alinutį pusei, ar bent atitraukti nuo Vokietijos. Vokietij atfortretas sako, kad pastangos bus dar viena "iluzija".

Europos mosprednėj svarbomas jau nėra Londone, bet kitur, sako nazij laikrašciai.

## SPIRIA ITALUS SUDERINTI SANTAKIUS SU SSSR.

Berlynas. — Vokiečiai daro pandingant ant Italijos, kad finalį pirkutis al'ejų iš SSSR. Tam reiki prekybos sutarties, kuri pagerintųsantykius abelau.

Sudarties tu galint bloką Europoj galima įvesti "naują tvarką", sako naziai.

I Anglijos ir Francijos aiškėnimo, kad Hitlerio ir Mussolini konferencija laikyta pravedintoj Vokietijos taikos ofensyvo, naziai piktai atšaukia, kad jie laikos nepaiso, jeigu kiti nori karo.

## Reikalauja Atšaukt J. V. Ministerį Kanadai

Washington, kovo 20. — Senatorius Clark, narys senato užsienio reikalų komiteto, ir kongresmanas Tinkham reikalauja atšaukti Jungtinių Valstijų ministerį Kanadai, James H. Rowell už jo pasakytą prakalbą Toronte, kurioje jis atakavo Vokietiją, kaip diplomati nepridera.

Senatorius sako, kad jis elgiasi panašiai, kaip buvusis Amerikos ambasadorius W. H. Page, Anglijoj, laike pasaulinio karo.

## Kunigas Kaltinamas Suokalbybį Nužudyti Vyrą, Gauti Apraudą

Uniontown, Pa., kovo 20. — Kunigas Clayton Miller ir Amelija Santilli suminti ir kaltinami suokalbybį nužudyti Santillienės vyrą, kad gauti jo apraudos pinigų.

Abu jie prisipažino kaltindami vienas kitą tos piktadarystės užnamyne.



### Negru Kongresas Smerkia Gubernatorių Horner

Sabotažoju legislatorus nutarimą iširti negru gyvenimą.

Mrs. Lillian Sumner smarkiai užtakavo gubernatorių Horner varde Negru Kongreso už nevykintį legislatorus nutarimo, padaryto meilai atgal, kad iširti negru ekonomiją ir socialinį gyvenimą ir paskui padaryti rekomendacijas jų luktes pagerinimui.

Legislatura perleido įstatymą įgaliojant gubernatorių paskirti komisiją iš penkių asmenų iširti negru būklę šioj valstijoje. Bet jis iki po šiai dienai nieko nedaręs, sako Mrs. Sumner.

Toliau ji nurodo apie Negru Kongreso, Chicago's skryniaus veikimą, jog negrai reikalauja Hornerio vykinti legislatorus nutarimą, tai yra, nusikirti aukščiau žymėtą komisiją.

Dar ne viskas. Koncertai juk yra rengiami ir į juos žmonės čia pasigrožėti dainos ir muzikos menu. Yra koncertai ir "koncertai". Iš nekurių "koncertų" žmonės gryžta namo nusivyle, negavę to, ko tikėjosi. Gerą koncertą ne bent kas gali surengti.

"Vilnis" rengė ir praėjty koncertus ir dėl jų programo saumoni nemalau reikalo atsirpašyti. Bet šis Jubiliejinis Koncertas bus visų koncertų "Tėvas".

## IRON CITY YOUTH CONCLUDE C.I.O. COOPERATION PACT

PITTSBURGH, Pa. — Cooperation between the CIO and the American Youth Congress, as offered by John L. Lewis in his speech to the Youth Congress' Citizenship Institute in Washington, D.C. some weeks ago, took shape here when the Steel City Industrial Council last week voted to carry through joint action with the Pittsburgh branch of the Youth Congress.

This action was taken after the Steel Council heard Frances Williams, National Administrative Secretary of the American Youth Congress, speak on the Youth Congress movement, the American Youth Act and the needs of the young people.

NEW ORLEANS, La.—An exhibition of painting and sculpture by young Negro artists in the Southern states will be a feature of the Fourth All-Southern Negro Conference when it meets in New Orleans, Louisiana, from April 18 to 21.

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Event of the week in Washington is the report of the Senate Interstate Commerce Committee favoring a \$25,000 investigation of wire-tapping by government and private police and detective agencies.

The report recommends passage of S Res 224, introduced by Senator Green of Rhode Island. While it deals with only one phase of lawless practices charged to the Federal Bureau of Investigation and to countless other police bodies throughout the country, the investigation called for would expose to public light one of the most flagrant evils of "law enforcement"—and of unlawful spying as well. Although the resolution has been reported favorably to the Senate, a wide public campaign may be essential in obtaining its passage.

The public clamor which has arisen out of disclosures of illegal activities of the FBI—first the denunciation on the floor of Congress, January 9, by Vito Marcantonio, of J. Edgar Hoover's card index files of persons with those economic and political views Hoover does not agree; then in the brutal and unlawful treatment of eleven persons arrested in Detroit charged with recruiting for Loyalist Spain—bears its first fruit in this week's Senate Committee recommendation.

### Whipping Post Used in Du Pont's Town

WILMINGTON, Del. — Eight men were given a total of 80 lashes in the courtyard of the New Castle county workshop recently in the country's most dramatic application of this form of punishment that has come down from colonial times.

As a driving sleet and snow storm swirled about them, the men were led in pairs, stripped to the waist and shackled to an ancient whipping post, with their hands and arms above their heads.

At the same time, ever since the return of the delegates from Washington, there has been an increasing amount of activity in connection with the American Youth Act. As a result of a talk made at a legislative conference in the Allegheny Valley two weeks ago, local unions throughout that area have been inviting the Pittsburgh Youth Council to send speakers.

Of signal importance is the establishment of a Youth Auxiliary Organizing Committee at East Pittsburgh. In that town, more than 300 young people were present at a meeting sponsored by Local 601, of the UERMWA. This is the local in the Westinghouse plant.

After listening to Frances Williams and to returned local delegates as well as the union speakers, the young people set up an executive committee of 25 which is empowered to proceed with the organization of a youth auxiliary for the union

## Anti - Alien Bills Slip Silently Into Congress

### Soviet Spend Millions for Health, Education of Byelo-Russians

BYELOSOTOK, USSR.—The 1940 budget of the Baranovich region of the West Byelo-Russia testifies to the concern of the Soviet government for the health and cultural development of the population.

The expenditures on education run to 68,000,000 rubles. Kindergartens alone are assigned 1,900,000 rubles.

3,100,000 rubles have been assigned to adult schools in which 75,000 people study.

Expenditures on public health amount to 35,000,000 rubles.

The budget totals 177,000,000 as against 9,100,000 rubles for the former Novogrudski Voevodstvo as the Baranovich region was formerly called.

## Nearly Half of America Lives On Less than \$50 Per Month

NEW YORK — Economists studying the results of a survey made by the bureau of labor statistics, the bureau of home economics and the WPA have learned new facts concerning American living habits:

Nearly half of America lives on less than \$50 per month and two-thirds of all the families in the country average only \$16 per week.

Fourteen per cent of the total population exists on \$28 per month.

Richest one per cent of the population has as much income as the 40 per cent of the population in the lowest brackets.

Fourteen per cent of the people spend only \$1 per person each week for food—they get only 6

### Marcantonio to Speak for 3 'Contempt' Victims Mass Meeting, March 23

Congressman Vito Marcantonio (American Labor Party—N.Y.) will speak at a mass meeting called by the Budenz-Patterson-Wirtz Defense Committee, Saturday, March 23, 8 p.m. at the Midland Hotel, 172 West Adams.

The meeting has been arranged to protest criminal contempt charges in the court of Superior Court Judge John J. Lupe against Louis F. Budenz, former editor of the Chicago Daily Record; and two ILL leaders—William L. Patterson, national vice-president; and Bob Wirtz, acting state secretary.

On the afternoon of the 23rd, Congressman Marcantonio will speak on his enlarged WPA bill at a mass meeting called by the Illinois Conference on Social Legislation at Ashland Auditorium, Ashland Ave and Van Buren Sts.

### Bills That Would Restrict, Intern, Deport, or Jail Foreign Born Are Not Publicized But Endanger Political Rights of American Residents

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Under the cloak of frenzied ultra and pseudo patriotism, bills that would restrict, intern, deport or jail the foreign born have been slipping quietly into the congressional hopper, offered mainly by bourbons from the poll-tax states.

Publicity has been hushed, controversy avoided.

As Kenneth Crawford, president of the American Newspaper Guild, declared at a recent conference to protect foreign born, "one of the great frauds of American politics is being perpetrated."

Passage of this legislation is a threat in today's warnongering. Tomorrow it may be a weapon

to smash all political dissidence. Some of the bills now before Congress follow:

HR 7922, Woodrum, D. Indiana—Amendment enabling FHA to bar non-citizens from federal low-rent housing projects.

HR 8438, Schulte, D. Indiana—Amendment (Navy Department Appropriation Bill) barring non-citizens from skilled, technical, clerical, administrative, or supervisory positions in Panama Canal Zone.

HR 8668, Lanham, D. Texas—Amendment (War Department Appropriation Bill) with same provisions as above, applying to positions under War Department. Passed after House had been made aware it would abrogate Panama—US treaty proclaimed by President July 27, 1939, assuring no discrimination against natives of Panama, who may have become American citizens.

HR 6724, Starnes, D. Alabama—Provides for deportation at any time after entry of non-citizens admitting in writing they engaged in "sabotage" or "espionage"; passed by Senate with amendment after passage by House; at present in conference.

HR 5643, Hobbs, D. Alabama—Provides possible imprisonment for life without trial for certain non-citizens; pending on Senate calendar.

S 2830, Stewart, D. Tennessee and S 409, Reynolds, D. North Carolina—Provides for registration of non-citizens; both bills reported by Senate Immigration Committee and on Senate calendar.

HR 4860, Dempsey, D. New Mexico—Provides for deportation of non-citizens believing in or belonging to organizations advocating any "change in the American form of government".

Besides these, there are numerous other bills, at least twenty, which are pending in the various congressional committees.

## BRITISH WORKERS HAIL SOVIET-FINNISH PEACE

Special to Inter-Continent News LONDON —(ICN)—Working class organizations here are expressing widespread satisfaction with the Soviet-Finnish peace treaty.

The official leadership of the trade unions and the Labor Party is pursuing its usual course of attacking the Soviet Union, but this is not cutting much ice with the rank and file movement.

The general attitude in the working class movement is shown by the fact that the executive committee of the 350,000 strong National Union of Railwaymen passed a resolution just before the peace unanimously rejecting the Trade Union Congress appeal for funds for the Mannerheim government. The executive committee also condemned the recent delegation to Finland led by Sir Walter Citrine and called upon the National Labor Council to refrain from actions likely to split the working class movement and extend the war front.

The London Peace Federation which has many thousands of members affirms the peace with satisfaction. The Federation "congratulates the Scandinavian peoples for their determined maintenance of neutrality" and calls upon its supporters "to celebrate the peace by rigid opposition to further attempts to spread the war against the Soviet Union or against other neutral states and to intensify the campaign for ending the present unjust war."

The Manchester Branch of the Upholsterers Union denounces the "policy of the present government to drag the people of this country into war against the Soviet Union", in a resolution which declares the present war is being fought for profit and colonial domination and can only bring the workers "further misery, bloodshed, and sacrifice."

These examples are typical of large numbers of resolutions passed by working class organizations throughout the country.

# Soviet-Finnish Treaty Is A Victory for Peace

MOSCOW—March 16.—(ICN) —The significance of the Soviet-Finnish peace treaty extends far beyond the relations between the two countries, declares Ivestia, organ of the Soviet government, in an editorial. The treaty has not only liquidated the anti-Soviet military base which the enemies of the USSR so carefully prepared for ten years; it has destroyed the Allied plots against the independence and peace of the neutral countries.

The treaty shows, says Ivestia, "that neither in diplomatic negotiations nor after a successful test of her military might does the Soviet Union present demands to anybody, be it her smallest neighbor, which would be incompatible with its national independence. It shows further, declares the editorial, that once having advanced just demands the Soviet Union "has every possibility of achieving their realization within the shortest space of time even under the most unfavorable conditions."

And finally, declares the editorial, the treaty shows that "small (and not only small) countries which rely on all kinds of 'guarantees' become the tool of interests alien to them, take a dangerous path" and can rid themselves of the terrible consequences of this "only by coming out on a path of independent and judicious policy."

Ivestia points out that the treaty lays the basis for the development of stable and good-neighborly relations between Finland and the Soviet Union and emphasizes that "neither in spirit nor content" does it encroach on the independence or sovereign rights of the Finnish Republic.

The editorial, "The Triumph of the Peace Policy of the USSR" reads:

"The peace treaty signifies something more than simply the immediate cessation of military hostilities between the Soviet Union and Finland. It liquidates the anti-Soviet military base which the enemies of the USSR so carefully prepared for ten years at the very gates of Leningrad. Simultaneously, it strengthens the security of the whole coast of the Gulf of Finland, strengthens the security of the Murmansk railroad—this important artery of the Soviet north—and finally, strengthens the security of Murmansk itself.

"The treaty of March 12th ensures this security not only thru the sensible and just shifting of the Soviet Finnish frontier alone. At the same time it lays the basis for the development of stable good-neighborly relations between the two countries.

"The article in the treaty regarding the joint construction by the Soviet Union and Finland of a new railroad for the development of transit of goods between the USSR and Sweden, go to show that the treaty of March 12 lays a firm basis for Soviet-Finnish collaboration in the sphere of economy.

"Neither in spirit nor in content does the treaty of March 12 in the slightest degree encroach on the independence and sovereign rights of the Finnish Republic, the independence which she received twenty-two years ago from the hands of the Soviet state.

"The Soviet Union did not want to embark on military operations against Finland and did everything depending on her to avert them. But the very same forces that unleashed the new imperialist war in Europe, the very same forces that are also now striving to spread the war on a world scale—these forces urged Finland to come out against her great and powerful neighbor with arms in hand.

"The proposals which the Soviet Union made to Finland in October of last year were a natural and integral part of those peace measures of great scope undertaken by the Soviet Union in the situation of a developing war between the biggest European states. The excellent results this peace policy of the Soviet Union has yielded are known to all. The USSR's treaties with Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania have already brilliantly justified themselves. These pacts have not only ensured lasting peace between the USSR and the three Baltic countries, not only ensured the security of these countries as well as the security of the USSR on definite sectors of her vast frontier. They have at the same time helped the extensive development of economic relations between the contracting parties to their mutual advantage.

"All the more, therefore, was it necessary to ensure the security on the northwestern frontier of the Soviet Union, on the frontier bordering with the Finnish Republic. Negotiations, however, regarding corresponding changes in the Finnish-Soviet frontier led to no positive results as is known despite the reasonableness of the Soviet proposals, despite the concessions made by the Soviet party in the very course of the negotiations.

"And there came to pass what Lenin once spoke about in one of his speeches, namely, that when the Soviet power makes its proposals regarding peace, its words and statements should certainly be taken seriously, otherwise it may happen that the Soviet government will propose peace on worse conditions and receive this peace on better conditions.

"The wise peace policy of the

Soviet Union, supporting itself on the invincible might of the glorious Red Army and Navy knocked out the flaming torch from the hands of the warmongers. The wise peace policy of the Soviet government upset and destroyed the machinations plotted against the neutral countries. These countries have now heaved a great sigh of relief. The imminent danger to their independence, the imminent danger of involving them in war has passed. This is now loudly proclaimed by the press of these countries and above all by the press of the Scandinavia and Baltic states.

"The significance of the Soviet-Finnish peace treaty of March 12 extends far beyond the relations between the two countries—the participants of the treaty. The treaty is a real triumph of the peace policy of the Soviet Union.

"It shows firstly that neither in diplomatic negotiations nor after a successful test of her military might does the Soviet Union present demands to anybody, be it her smallest neighbor, which would be incompatible with its national dignity or which would in the slightest degree place in doubt its national independence.

"Secondly, it shows that the Soviet Union, once having advanced just demands, has every possibility of achieving their realization within the shortest space of time even under the most unfavorable conditions.

"Finally, it shows that small (and not only small) countries which rely on all kinds of 'guarantees' become a tool of interests alien to them, take a dangerous path and that they rid themselves of the terrible consequences of this only by coming out on a path of independent and judicious policy.

# AMERICAN SEAMEN LAUD USSR FOR BLOCKING WAR

NEW YORK—Taking their "hats off to Russia and the Red Army" a group of seamen who emphasize that they are not Communists last Saturday signed a statement lauding the establishment of peace in Finland and characterizing it as an aid to the United States in staying out of war.

The full statement with its 31 signers follows:

"As seamen who are the first affected by war in any part of the world, we want to express our opinion on the peace concluded between Russia and Finland. We are not members of the Communist Party. We do not believe in Communism.

"For a time it looked like the Scandinavian countries and the United States would be involved in war. It looked like a world gang-up on Russia. In spite of the newspaper and radio campaign, and the efforts of the Dukes and Barons and Herbert Hoover, the people would not consent to war.

"We take our hats off to Russia and the Red Army for making a promise and keeping it. They said all they wanted was to maintain friendly relations with Finland, to exchange certain territories to better be able to protect Finland and therefore be in a better position to protect herself. The peace reached shows that they kept their word.

"Instead of mopping up after Mannerheim surrendered, they just took some strategic islands and ports which they could have gotten by negotiations months ago. Finland today is independent. Today America's chances of staying out of war in Europe look much better.

"If what Russia does helps keep the United States out of war, why not friendly relations between the two greatest powers in the world? Not only to keep out of war, but to do everything possible to end the war in Europe so that there will be no war to get into."

The group meets on Friday at 8 p. m., at the Sherman Park field house at 53rd and Loomis Street. The membership invites any musician over eighteen years of age to bring his or her instrument and rehearse with the orchestra until an audition for permanent membership has been arranged.

The new conductor is now Mr. Alfred Schade. Officers are Mrs. Eva Pereira, president; James Mattelino, vice-president; Mrs. Estelle McCallip, treasurer; and Edward Miller, secretary.

# BEYOND THE HORIZON

A recent headline in *Jaunimas*, an irregular bi-weekly journal of Lithuanian-American youth published in Chicago, reads: "Zadeikis Hails Return of Jaunius as 'Only Rightful'". It is peculiar that *Jaunimas* should at last admit the forceful and undeniable fact that the Soviet Union did a service for Lithuania. But *Jaunimas* did it begrudgingly and the Only Rightful which appeared in the headline as a quotation by Zadeikis can not be found in the text of the item that follows. We don't think this was a typographical error on the part of the editors, but rather a conscious attempt to garble the news and to diminish the significance of the service rendered by the Soviet Union to Lithuania.

We wonder whether *Jaunimas* may have fallen under the influence of Pijus Grigaitis, the irreconcilable foe of the Soviet Union and everything the Soviet Union represents. It may be a possibility, for the last edition was printed at Naujienos.

Switching from Lithuania for a while, let's give the recent Soviet-Finnish treaty some consideration. For any clear sighted person, the Soviet-Finnish treaty represents an enormous victory for the cause of peace. But Naujienos, which "out-fought" even the most brazen typewriter generals of the capitalist press and won more victories for Finland than Finland could have won in the next twenty years, sees the peace accord as an indication of the weakness of the Soviet system. According to Naujienos the real reason behind the peace treaty was the "starvation" that existed in the Soviet Union.

But sober people will just scoff at such myths. For the Naujienos has been starving the Russian people for the last twenty years, but the Soviet people have really been ingrates and refused to starve.

Moreover, even the inestimable number of victories won by Naujienos for the Finnish White Guards was not sufficient to "win" for Finland, and the Soviets who had been severely "beaten" by Naujienos emerged victorious.

But what can be expected of a paper which has

gone over hand and baggage to Allied propaganda and which is trying to feed this poison to Lithuanians of America. That Naujienos is not against having American youth sacrificed on the battlefields of imperialism is evident from a recent attack leveled at the Lithuanian University Club because this organization adopted a resolution opposing United States entry into the imperialist bloodbath.

Results of recent nominations held by the LDS (Association of Lithuanian Workers) are heartening from two aspects. The first aspect is the wide interest taken by the membership in the nominations and secondly the impressive number of young people who received nominations for leading positions of a national organization. What other organization, amongst the Lithuanians even dares to allow young people such liberty and opportunity?

Read recently about the re-birth of the youth organization idea amongst the SLA. The idea was elaborated upon in an lengthy editorial in *Tėvynė* with only one hitch—that youth shouldn't think about organizing their own brand of sports but let the SLA determine what is best for them. Yes, this is recognition of the youth problem but it omits the democratic slant—that of allowing youth to determine for themselves what they should have.

Perhaps it would be a grand idea to have a sizeable delegation of young people at the SLA convention that will be held here this summer. Maybe then a policy could be worked out which would honestly recognize the youth as a vital section of the organization.

Speaking about conventions reminds us that the LDS will hold their Fifth bi-ennial convention in New York late this summer. One feature of LDS conventions has been that youth always play a prominent part. At their last convention in Pittsburgh over 50 youth delegates attended and twice that number took part in the Sports Olympiad and National LDS Softball Championship games.

Was a gallant at court and a hunted man who escaped the gallows. Rene tells Huguette that Villon has been freed from jail but two days and boasts that he can kiss as well as Villon. Rene attempts to kiss her. She draws her dagger and would have slit Rene's throat hadn't others interferred.

Tabarie the comedian and great follower of Villon enters the Tavern and yells for wine. The crowd gathers around him and asked of Villon's whereabouts. Tabarie revealed to them that Villon has been writing verses while in jail for a lovely lady. This doesn't interest them and the occupants slowly vanish. Two new comers enter disguising the crafty, suspicious King Louis XI in a huge black cape. With him is his bodyguard and trusted confident Tristan. While they order some of the smuggled wine from Margot, Villon sings the song of the "Vagabonds" which he wrote while in jail. Villon gets a hearty reception from his friends. He tells them of the loveliest lady he has ever seen in his life. He first caught her eye as she entered the church and sent verses to her when she came out again. To his estimation she was the flower of his Majesty's court.

In the meantime the King tells Tristan of his dream that he was a swine rooting in the streets of Paris and found a pearl of great price in the gutter. He placed the pearl in his crown. It shone so brightly that it lit all of Paris and with its lighting a great shawl fell from heaven.

King Louis XI was a very superstitious character and consulted astrologers when he dreamt. His purpose for visiting the Tavern was that he was aware of the Grand Marshall Thibaut making frequent visits here.

Villon boasts of what he would do if he were King and says the king is a mere puppet who wears a royal crown. Just then Tabarie shouts there's two women striped to the waist outside which arouses a fight. The tavern is cleared as Vagabonds love excitement. Lady Katherine enters the Tavern. King Louis and Tristan recognizes her and hides as she converses with Villon. She asks if he wrote the verses for her. He commits himself and says he would write more if she desired. She tells him that Thibaut and d'Assigny the Grand Marshall of France had plotted to open the gates of Paris to the Burgundians. Katherine asks Villon to kill Thibaut. Thibaut would make his entrance at the tavern that night. Villon directs Katherine to the gallery where she was to indicate when he arrived.

After Thibaut's entrance Villon gets into a sword fight with Thibaut. Villon wounds him. The Captain of the archers enters with more archers and Thibaut orders the occupants of the Tavern be herded together and marched off to the dungeons. Visions of being hanged fill their eyes. Katherine throws a rose to the floor Villon picks it up. In merriment King Louis XI commands that Villon be made King for 24 hours.

The next day in the garden King Louis consults his astrologer. The pearl of great price that he picked up in the gutter meant that there is one person if exalted would save the State. Louis immediately appoints Francois Villon the New Grand Marshall. Oliver, the royal barber, trims his beard while the pages bring him cloaks and clean linens to clothe him. As Grand Constable he must convict the prisoners as they are heard at trial. King Louis XI commands that Villon must win the hand of haughty Lady Katherine or swing from the gallows.

## CALIFORNIA STUDENTS FIGHT BAN ON BRIDGES MEETING

BERKELEY, March 11 (ICN)—An administration ban on Harry Bridges, among other asserted violations of civil rights on the University of California campus was the subject of a projected conference this week between an official student committee and the university administration.

The American Student Union chapter here has charged that on two occasions it was denied permission to invite the longshoremen's leader to speak on the campus on the question of peace, whereas the administration welcomed Pierre de Lanux, avowed official propagandist for the French government, and permitted him to speak at Wheeler Auditorium.

Other grievances of the A. S. U. are:

1. Despite unanimous permission granted by the Associated Students of the University of California (ASUC) executive committee, student governing body, the administration forbade the sale of "The Yanks Are NOT Coming" pamphlets and buttons on the campus.

2. A gag decision has been handed down by an administration spokesman to the ASU, prohibiting discussion of certain topics, like the recently recommended dismissal of liberal professor Becroft, at ASU meetings held on campus.

The ASU chapter, heading a delegation of 100 students, presented these grievances to a meeting of the ASUC executive committee which appointed two sub-

committees which appointed two sub-committees to elicit reasons from the administration for the action taken.
