

Amerikoj yra demoralizatorių, kurie gąsdina Amerikos žmones Sovietų laimējimu. Prezidentas Rooseveltas teisingai sako, kad tos rųšies propaganda yra priešu propaganda, propaganda, kokią Anglijoj vedē Cliveden klika, kuri tarnavo hitlerizmui

Komentuodamas šiuos prezidento žodžius, Chicagos "Sun" pažymi, kad Rusija yra vienatinė viltis, kad laimėti šį karą, nepaaukaujant milionus Amerikos gy-vasčių. "Sun" sako: "Jei Rusija šiais metais butų sumušta, tas reikštų, kad Amerika butų sumušta sekančiais metais, ar kitaip, mes turētume paaukot tiek gyvasčių, kad sunku ir įsivaizduoti".

Francuziją pražudē abidvi išdavikų grupēs, o ne viena jų. Jei vieni kalė, tai kiti "zalatijo." Daladiero išdavystė pra-sidėjo Municho dienose. Socialistas Blumas užgyrė Munichą. Tai buvo pradžia Francuzijos žlugimo. Petainas su Darlanu užbaigė tą judošystę, kurią pradėjo Daladieras ir Blumas.

Jokio skirtumo tarpe jų nebuvo. Skirtumas tik tas, kad Hitleris pasirinko savo liokajais ne originalę išdayikų grupę, bet tą, kuri labiau stovējo už kulisų ir kuri, vėliaus, sutiko paleisti Francuziją ant licitacijos, paliekant ją nuogą ir pliką.

Laisvieji Francuzijos sunus žiurės į tą bylą kaip į šlykščią komediją. Jie kovoja ir kovos už tokią Francuziją, kuri iškels bylą visiems išdavikams, pradėjus Dala-dier'u, baigiant pačiu Petainu.

To rustaus ir begailestingo teismo diena ateis vēliau ar anksčiau.

Piliečių veikimas privertė Laukaitį ir kitus rengimo komisijos narius laikytis savo žodžio. Matyt, buvo prižaděje susilaikyti nuo perdidelių eksesų savo kalbose. Taipgi pašvesti savo mitinga delei geresnių tikslų, negu "šelpimas Lietuvių Pabēgēlių Berlyne."

Štai ir dabar atvyko iš Chicagos veik visa Lietuvai Vaduoti Sąjungos centro valdyba, taip pat ir Lithua-nian National Relief Fund valdyba, kad kaip nors "išstreitinus" visa dalyką.

Nazis Attempt To Force Lithuanians To Give Up Cothing

STOCKHOLM, - An ultimatum to Lithuanian residents requiring them to relinquish all warm clothing, was issued last week by German authorities. The ultimatum required that the clothing be brought to specified places within twenty four hours.

German authorities have not attempted to conceal the fact that the clothing thus obtained will be utilized by Nazi soldiers on the Russian front.

Swedish sources have not learned whether the ultimatum was complied with by the anti-Nazi Lithuanian populas. It is believed however, that if there was compliance, only a few persons were involved. This belief is based on an article ap-pearing in "Deutsche Zeitung" written by Oestland Commisar Lohse in which he states that, "Lithuanians have reacted slowly toward fullfillment of a gift quota for the Reich armed

1.800 Jews Killed In Nazi Occupied Lithuania


LONDON. - An official Polish documentary release reveals the slaughter of 1,800 Jews in the Vilnius region of Lithuania. Other thousands met death in Trakuose, which is 20 miles from Vilnius.

Six hundred were slain in Nemunaičiuose and 200 in Eisiskese. The same source reveals that whereas previously 70,000 Jews resided in Vilnius, today only 40,000 of them are alive.

Reliable sources have it that some 15,000 Jews were sent to the Eastern front as labor battalions. It is claimed that they met death there.

Many Lithuanian Jews are today in concentration camps. In Poland the death toll of Jews was acute due to the spread of typhus.

The official Polish government release revealed other atrocities also com-Nazis.



WORD TO

It was shocking the other week when the story came out in the newspapers that the United States has failed to meet its own pledges to Soviet Russia. Our shipments of material, promised at the Moscow Conference last autumn, have not been delivered on schedule. Less than 50% is the record so far. And this story is confirmed by Averell Harriman himself.

Let's ask ourselves what the world would be like today, if, while Japan opened up aganst us in the Pacific, Hitler had been able to plough through the Caucasus and come out on the other side of India. Just to think about such a nightmare is to appreciate what the Soviet counter-offensive has meant for the whole Allied cause. And just to think of what the Russians have done this winter, and at what a fearful cost to themselves, is to feel heartsick, at your own failure to keep America's pledged word.

And the whole thing is a desperately serious matter because the spring is not far off. All winter long the Nazis have had uniterrupted time for accelerating their war production. Reports are that their aircraft output has increased. Slave labor mitted by the German has been conscripted from Hitler's colonies all over Europe. The Russians themselves emphasize that the Germans may still have tank superiority-by the time the ground hardens on the Soviet western plains. Such sober observers as George Fielding Eliot remind us that Hitler has enough manpower for big battles.

The Red Army is trying to hold its end up. It has done so heroically, smashing into those positions from which Hitler intends to jump off. The least we Americans can do is to hold our own end up. We must live up to the pledges which our accredited representatives made in Moscow in fulfillment of our basic national policies.

And this is not Russia's interest aloneas the slimy appeasers are saying throughout the land. It is in our interest, the common interest of the Allies, and the interests of our own country whose fate is bound up with the farflung battlefront. As Sir Stafford Cripps puts it, "If by our efforts we mean to make the spring offensive in Europe a decisive success for the Russians, we shall not only save hundreds of thousands of Russian lives, but British and American lives as well."

WE ARE NOT GOING TO GO into a polemic with a type like Mr. F. J. Bagocius who associates himself with the allegedly pro-Nazi "Committee to Promote Democracy" but is it not interesting that when he wrote an stupid "open letter" to "Vienybe", a pro Smetona paper (and Mr. Smetona should also do a lot of explaining if what we hear is true), that several newspapers which published reams of Nazi propaganda began to quote him editorially with such glee. They did this without asking Bagocius, himself, to give an explanation about the charges leveled at him, nor checking the veracity fo his statement. It is a sign of how low some Lithuanian American journalists stoop sometimes. First, there was the Nazi proaganda which came DIRECTLY FROM BER-LIN, then came the tactic of one paper pulling something out of a sewer and every other one quoting the item until it has made all the rounds. The more stupid and more filthy the lie is, the more decorations each succeeding editor who reprints it will make. Biting hook, line and sinker for this propaganda is the "Weak Lithuanian American" of Chicago, which, for very good reas-ons, recently changed its name from Jaunimas."

WE JUST WANT TO POINT OUT what stupidity there is in the Bagocius slur. In the first place he accuses John Orman of being a slack er" in the last war. Orman, according to my information, was born in 1911. They did not take soldiers as young as he was when the United States entered the war. The matter of "picketing the White House" is also a bit of foolishness. On the date Orman is said to have picketed the White House, he was not in New York, but not in Washington either. He was in Massachusetts, in Boston and Montello and attended a picnic in Worcester the next day. He certainly must get around pretty fast, and be in quite a lot of places at the same time, that guy. Kahn, another able journalist. These people are not to trifled with, F. J. Why don't you explain what this so-called "Committee to Promote Democracy" is all about? And who, by the way, appointed YOU, of all people, to "represent" the Lithuanian Americans on it and thereby drag the good name of the Lithuanians through mud? We would hate to see things happen to the Lithuanian Alliance of America as happened to that Ukranian fraternal organization (with 40,000 members and four million dollars) whose funds were frezen and many members reportedly are being investigated. All this occured because some of the leaders of that orga nization had some very questionable ties with very questionable people.

WHY NOT TELL THE PEOPLE, F. J., exactly where you served in the U.S.A. Army in the last war, and what rank you have as an officer in that army? It is rumored that you made a lot of money during the last war—well, if you made the money—how, F. J.? Did you help people to fill out their Army draft questionnaires? Was there a fee? "In the course of the war, it is quite likely that groups of frustrated people, in an attempt to magnify their own importance or their own fears and preindices. will take on the hood of the Vigilante. It makes little people feel bigger to decry a religious or racial group, to attack the Catholics or the Jews or the Negroes or Jehovah's Witnesses or some other minority. The Jehovah's Nazi way of life, in so far as it can penetrate our shores, will encourage such activity.

"Some such vigilantism is perhaps inevitable in a time of great national crisis; the strains and stresses of war bring out the worst as well as the best in men. But it is well worth noting that equally inevitable is the retribution which awaits both the enemies without and the betrayers within our democracy. The Federal Government is well prepared to deal with vigilantism. Within the Department of Justice the Civil Rights Section has fought and will continue to fight to defend the rights and the liberties of all those entitled to the protection of our borders-citizens and aliens alike."

William L. Batt, Director of Materials Division, War Production Board:

"This is no time for selfhypnotism. We're strong. We're tough. Yes. But so is the other fellow.
