Kiek visokie reacininkai netriukšmautų prieš Tarybų Sąjungą, lietuviškėji jų kolegoms savo stačioniškumu juos visuomet pralenkia. Ir ne vien stačioniškumu, bet ir savo idiotiškais kalbinimais.

“Lietuvos ministeris” Zadeikis, kaip mūsų skaitytojai jau žino, įteikė Jungtinių Tautų Organizacijai “skundą” prieš Tarybų Sąjungą. Zadeikio “skunde”, kaip vedamuoju straipsniu praneša “Draugas”, daugiensia remiamasis ant “Vyriausio Lietuvos Išlaisvinimo Komiteto darinių”.

Neverta sustoti prie visų kalbinimų, nes lietuviškų reacininkų “argumentai” ir tonas jau gerai žinomas. Dar atmename tuos prieškarinius laikus, kuomet jie mums pasakojo, kad “lietuviai kaliniai Sibire vaikšto su varpeliais ant kaklų, kaip karvės, kad jie taigose nepaklystų”.

Negailime sakyti, kad Zadeikis nieko originališko nesugalvojo. Naujaisiais kalbinimais yra, kad kaliniai “besidigdami nuo mirties ir bado šiaudus ir voratinklius (l) valgo...”

Beje, “Draugas” pats neišsėkė, kad JTO imis domėtį tu Sietosnis liekanų “skundą”, ir taip sako vedamajame straipsnyje.

Don Nichotai tebelepėja: “Draugas” sako, kad “Darbininkas” rašo, jog Vakarų Europoje girdėtasis iš Rygos pranešimas, jog Lietuvis “partizanų armija, kuriai vadovauja dar nepriklausomybės laikų trys generolai”, be atodarios kaunasi su bolševikų aštuoniomis (l) divizionais”.

Ir pridėdama, kad “žutūbitinėse kovose talkina lenkai, vokiečiai ir nelaisvės paimtieji sovietų karininkai”.

Be abejonės, tai ta pati “partizanų armija”, kuri Ačino pranešimais randasi gerai maskuota “pogrindiniuose blindazuose, kuriuos suva milžiniški tankai”. Be abejonės, tos “žutūbitinės kovos” vyksta kur nors viename bulvių skelpe... .

Vienas faktas čia nenoromis išskeltas: kad fašistiniams banditams, kurie dabar jau beveik sunaikinti, talkininkavo vokiečiai naciai, ir ne tik talkininkavo, bet dauguma fašistinių banditų darinių buvo pasistipėję nacių karininkų ir SS kriminalistų vadovaujami.

Patys Arūno tipo korespondentai praicyje pripažino, kad “partizanų tarpe (suprask: banditų) dažnai girdisi vokiečių kalba”.

Aštuonios divizionos tai yra apie 100,000 armijos. Laikytis prieš tokią armiją gaujoms besispastancijai, aišku, reiktų turėti kur kas daugiau kaip 100,000 vyrų.

Kas gi tikės, kad Lietuvis gretų tokią fašistinę gaują slapstyti ir dar atsilaikyti prieš 8 divizionas.

Ta kvaila pasaka yra produktas neblaivos vaizduotės. Ji rodo, kad lietuvį fašistai tik Hitlerio samprotavimui, jog “juo didesnis melas, tuo lengviau žmonės jam patikės”.

Hitlerio dideli melai betgi ji patį padėjo jo žeme.

Naujas Hitleris?

Gen. Charles de Gaulle ragina sudaryti trijų valstybių—Francūzijos, Britanijos ir Jungtinių Valstijų—sutarį prieš Tarybų Sąjungą ir prieš "komunizmo pavojų". Tokia sutartis būtų nauja ašis prieš TSRS.

De Gaulle eina Hitlerio keliu. 1935 metais Vokietija išstojo iš Tautų Sąjungos ir metais vėliau Hitleris pasirašė "Prieš Kominterną" sutartį su Japonija. Vėliau ton sutartin įtraukta Italija ir susidarė ašis prieš Tarybų Sąjungą, nors pasivadė to ašim prieš Kominterną.

Ta ašis pradėjo visą eilę agresijų ir pagaliau sukūrė Antrąjį Pasaulinį karą. Ką de Gaulle dabar siūlo yra nė mažiau, nė daugiau kaip pamėgdžiujamas Hitlerio ašies. Tikslas naujos ašies irgi toks pats.

Gen. de Gaulle buvo didelis reakcininkas. Jis nesutiko su kitais Francūzijos militaristais tik dėl vadovybės, ir dėlto, kad jis norėjo mechanizuoti Francūzijos armiją, o kiti generalai manė, kad "Maginot Linija" apsaugos Francūziją ir nepaisė armiją mechanizuoti ir gerinti. De Gaulle paskui palinko prie Aliantų, bet čionai jįsai niekuomet nesijautė namie. Jis ypač Rooseveltą nekentė, o Rooseveltas jo nepaisė.

De Gaulle kur kas geriau tiko ašies fronte. Dabar kai Hitlerio ir Mussolinio ašis sumusta, de Gaulle nori naują suorganizuoti. Jo militarinė sąjunga būtų tikrai nauja ašis tais pačiais siekiniais kaip ir Hitlerio—užmaugti demokratiją.

Jį padrasino atvirai apie tai kalbėti mūsų užsienio politika, kuri palaiko tokias fasisistuojančias valdžias kaip Graikijos. Veikiausia Francūzijos žmonės nesiduos de Gaulle tempti šalį į naują karą. De Gaulle pastangos nueis niekais, bet jeigu jam pavyktų, tai naujas karas neišvengtinas.

Teroras Italijoje

Netoli Milano fašistas, Uomo Qualunque narys, nušovė žmogų dalyvavusį kairiųjų demonstraciją. Sicilijoje nužudytas unijos vadas Vito Piptone, einant iš valstiečių mitingo. Bologna užmuštas buvęs partizanais.

De Gasperio valdžia, kaip rodos, nieko nedaro fašistinio teroro sulaukymui. Italijos demokratinę žmonės dėlto labai supyko. Milane mūnia žmoniu, keršindami už nužudymą demonstranto, sudaužė fašistinės partijos buveinę.

De Gasperio politika, nesistengimas suvaldyti fašistinių teroristų, taigi, veda prie riaušių ir susirėmimų, nuo ko ta pati valdžia gali griuti.

De Gasperio valdžia matomai mano, kad terorojimu komunistų ir socialistų jį savo poziciją sustiprins. O gal ji jaučia, kad kitais būdais jį pasilaikyti negalės.

Atominės Bombos

Paskelbimas, jog Tarybų Sąjungoje išbandyta atominė bomba jau birželio mėnesį gali daug ką pakeisti tarptautiniuose sąlytiniuose. Tada jau atsaldė daugelio įkaitimų karo prieš Tarybų Sąjungą.

Perdaug įkaitę karo karščiu nenori tikėti, kad TSRS turi atominės bombas. Kiti sako, kad TSRS negali masiniai ty bombų gaminti. Bet ir taip kalbant jau nerodo to entuziazmo naujam karui, ką pirmuosius rodė.

Raminimas, kad TSRS masiniai negali gaminti yra savęs vylimas. Argi reikia šimtų tūkstančių atominų bombų didieciūs sunaikinti, milijonus žmonių iš-

žudyti? Kita, TSRS juk yra milžiniška šalis su dideliais gamybos galimūmais.

Paašikėjimas, kad ir TSRS turi atominės bombas, o jau seniau aiškinta, kad jį turi kiti naujovinių baltų karo įnagių, naują karą padaro dar pavojingesniu. Jau dabar negali būti abejonų, kad atominis karas būtų visai žmonijai pragaistis.

Kaip iš to išsigelbėti? Liko tik vienas būdas: Amerikai ir Tarybų Sąjungai susitarti, kooperuoti taikos palaikymui. Jei šios dvi šalys susikalbės, kitos šalys nedrįs karo pradėti.

Potsdamas ir Berlynas

Artinantis Londono konferencijai, kurioje dalyvaus keturių didžiųjų jėgų užsienio reikalų ministrai, vis ryškėsnis darosi pavojus, kad vakarinės jėgos galutinai pavers Jaltos ir Potsdamo sutartis beverciais dokumentais.

Niekas negali paneigti fakto, kad Potsdamo sutartis jau pakartotinai buvo apėita gyvybiniais klausimais, ypatingai reparacijų klausimu. Dabar prieš valdžios artimi rateliai atvirai kalba, kad Amerikos delegacija vyrauja tendencija dar labiau atsitolti nuo sutarties dvasios.

Tuo tarpu Varšuvoje, Paryžiuje ir kitose sostinėse kalbama, kad jeigu vakarinės jėgos Potsdamo sutartį galutinai padarys beverte, Tarybų Sąjungą reikalauja, kad jos ištrauktų savo okupacines jėgas iš Berlyno.

Aišku, kad JAV, Britanijos ir Francūzijos jėgų ištraukimas iš Berlyno vokiečių būtų supras tas kaip simbolis, kad aliantų vienybė yra dar labiau pajūsi. Visi tais kokios pageidautojai nenori to matyti. Keturių jėgų okupacija Berlyne virš viso tarnauja vokiečiams kaip simbolis, kad juos valdo pergalingi sąjungininkai.

Beje, ta taip vadinama Českoslovakijos nacional-socialistų (tautinių socialistų) partija yra Benešo grupė, kuri dalyvauja koalicinėje valdžioje kartu su komunistais ir socialdemokratais. Bet, kaip pasirodo, kelių sričių tos partijos vadovybės guli aršų reakcininkų rankose, kaip minimoje Dobruskos srityje.

Kaip sakytą, visi taikos pageidautojai giliai tiki, kad prie to neprieis, bet jeigu prie to prieitų, atsakomybę kristų ant jų, kurie pirmieji pradėjo Potsdamo sutartį apėiti.

Kiek Gereliau

Palestinos klausimu, Jungtinių Valstijų ir Tarybų Sąjungos delegacijos balsavo išvieno. Pirmiaus jų pozicijos buvo skirtingos, bet padaryta kompromisas ir abi pozicijos suderintos.

Britanijos delegacija su tuo nesutikimas. Atsinešime link Franco režimo Ispanijoje, Britanijos ir Tarybų Sąjungos delegacijos balsavo vienai, o Jungtinių Valstijų—susilaikė nuo balsavimo.

Priimta rezoliucija, kuri tik užtvirtina pirmesį J. T. nusistatymą prieš Franco režimą. Ne viso šalys paėmė to. Tarybų Sąjungos delegatas Gromyko sakė, kad rezoliucija per silpna, bet jis balsavo už ją, taip ir Britanijos delegatas. Bet mūsų delegatas Charles Fahy net ir už tokią rezoliuciją ne balsavo.

Britanijos ir Amerikos nesutikimas, taigi Britanijos ir Amerikos sutikimas bent vienu klausimu su Tarybų Sąjunga, rodo kiek geresnę padėtį Jungtinėse Tautose. Jau nėra tokio griežto fronto prieš Tarybų Sąjungą visais klausimais.

Daugelis mažesnių šalių atstovų kiek pasidrasino.

Kitas geras žygis, tai Indijos delegatės Vijaya Lakshmi Pundit ištraukimas kandidatūros į Saugumo Tarybą. Lenkijos terminui pasibaigus Saugumo Taryboje, kandidatūs statė Ukrainą ir Indiją. Ukraina gavo daug daugiau balsų, bet negavo dviejų trečdalių, kaip taisyklės reikalauja. Taip dalykas ir stovėjo. Bet dabar Indijos kandidatūra ištraukta ir Ukraina laimi.

Saugumo Tarybos sudėtis pasiliks veik tokia pati, kaip buvo, nors bus keli nauji atstovai.

APŽVALGA

JŲ REKOMENDACIJA

Viename Českoslovakijos pasienio miestelyje policija suėmė keturius jaunus vyrus, kurie apipiešė kavinę. Paprastas apibėlimas ir suėmimas nebūtų vertas jokio dėmesio, bet dabar apie tai rašo visa šalies spauda, nes su tuom surištas kitas politinis įvykis.

Suimtieji vyrukai paašikino, kad jie rengėsi pereiti sieną į Bavariją, iš kur jie planavo pasiekti brity zoną. Jie pasisakė esą bolševizmo priešai, "tautinių socialistų" partijos nariai, kurie nori "pašvesti savo jėgas kovoję prieš bolševizmą." Tam reikalui jie norėjo stoti į Amerikos ar Britanijos armiją.

Svarbu, kad pas vieną buvo rastas liūdimas, kurį jam išdavė Dobruskos sričių "tautinių socialistų" partijos komitetas. Tame liūdimyje buvo sakytą:

Nacional socialistų partijos Dobruskos sritis komitetas rekomenduoja Toni Novaką, gimusį spalio 22 d. 1928 metais, kaip politiniai aktyvų mūsų partijos narij ir vakarinų idėjų šalininką. Šis liūdimas jam išduodamas dėl jo santykių su brity karine policija.

Cekų policijos organai dabar surado, kad tai ne vientėlis atsitikimas: konservatyvios partijos duoda visokių liūdimus jaunuoliams, kurie nelegaliai perėina sieną Vokietijon.

Beje, ta taip vadinama Českoslovakijos nacional-socialistų (tautinių socialistų) partija yra Benešo grupė, kuri dalyvauja koalicinėje valdžioje kartu su komunistais ir socialdemokratais. Bet, kaip pasirodo, kelių sričių tos partijos vadovybės guli aršų reakcininkų rankose, kaip minimoje Dobruskos srityje.

MALDINGA PONI ŠLIUPIENĖ

Brolukų Mšrijonų laikraštyje "Drauge" (lapkričio 8) skaitome: "Chicagoje buvo pamaldos už Lietuvą, o po to—vašies Lietuvosje svėtinėse. Tarp eilės garbingų svečių buvo ir Graislida Šliupienė—Grauslaitė, žmona velionies Dr. Jono Šliupo."

Tos maldos ir vašies veikiausia apmokamos iš surinktų Amerikos Lietuvių Tarybos aukų "Lietuvai gelbėti." Pagelbėta betgi ne Lietuvai, vienam klebonui, taigi svečiams, kurie vašinti svėtinėj.

Šliupienė klerikalų laikraščių sakius: "Turėjau anksčiau grįsti į Clevelandą, bet pasilikau pamaldoms. Už tėvyne, labai svarbu."

Įdomu, kad Dr. Šliupas mokindamas kitus laisvamanybės neįsmokino savo žmonos. Ji pasilik maldinga, kaip buvo atėjus pas Šliupus tarmauti.

Poni Šliupienė parodo nevien maldingumo, bet ir naitvykos. Norėdama perstatyti savo vyrą dideliu kovotoju

prieš bolševikus, jinai parodo visai ką kitą. Ji sakė: "Net komunistų partijos nariams stovėti šalia jis trenkdamas kumštimi į stalą, tardamas: 'Jei simpatizuoji bolševikams, nesivadink lietuviu vardu, nesivadink lietuviu. Esate išdavikais.'"

Jis taip darė Lietuvos žmonėms jau nusibalsavus stoti Tarybų Sąjungon ir jau įsikūrus tarybinei valdžiai Lietuvoje.

Klerikalai ir kiti valdžios priešai rėkė, kad Lietuvoje sumiti visi, kas tik kitaip manė kaip komunistai, ir iš-tremti Sibiran, bet poni Šliupienė parodo, kad ir aršūs tarybinės valdžios priešai nebuvo suimtinėjami.

Matomai pati pajutusi, kad toks jos vyrų karžygiškumo perstatymas parodo kaip tolerantiška buvo Lietuvos tarybinė valdžia, jį paskui sako, kad buvo paleistas gandas, kad suimtinėjami valdžios priešai Palangoj. Kodėl Šliupas nesuimtinat? Štai kodėl:

"Daktaras į kambarį atsinešė kirvį, geležinį štangų, pasiryžęs gintis."

Mat koks karžygis, su kirviu ir geležine štanga atsigynė nevien nuo policijos, bet nuo kariuomenės.

Tai yra naivu. Ji džiangiųjų, kad naciai pagalios jiems pagalbon atėjo, Lietuvą užimdami.

Anot Šliupienės, Daktaras karštai raginęs tilg "tėvą Kazimiera" pasilikiti Lietuvoje "liaudį raminti," bet jis pats nenorėjo "raminti" ir bėgo Vokietijon, kada Hitlerio armija traukėsi iš Lietuvos.

Šliupienė pripažįsta, kad jos vyras sakė prakalbas per nacių radiją. Norėdama jį pateisinti, ji sako:

"Mirė širdies ataku, susijaudinęs, kad naciai trūkdė jam pasakyti kalbą per radiją..."

Nacių propagandos ministerija netik neleidavo kalbėti savo priešams, bet juos šaudė ir gasius nuodijo. Kas leistas prie radijo, buvo naciams ištikimas.

Lietuviai kariai, girdėję Šliupin ir kitų nacių propagandistų kalbas, sako, kad je agitavę lietuvius kovoti nevien prieš Tarybų Sąjungos, bet ir Amerikos ir Britanijos armijas.

Šliupas buvo susijaudinęs tai griežiau bėgo, kad nacių armijos visuose frontuose bėgo atgal sumuštas, kad artinosi galas hitlerizmui ir tiems, kuriuos hitlerizmas globojo.

Kaip prastai jie jautėsi matydami Vokietijos armijos sugriuvimą, jinai tuiolo pasakod:

"Atvykus į Berling, susirinko artimieji ir kiti, jam kalbėdama: 'Irtu tu sumis ant tremtinio lazdos parimai, Visi verkė.'"

Girdi, tas susijaudinimas paveikė ir Šliupą.

Kur gi nepaveiks. Jie matyti tikėjosi, kad Vokietija atsilauks, laimės, bet jį viltys ėmė gėsti, kada ir vakary ir rytų fronte Hitlerio

50 METŲ VISUOMENINIO DARBO

Lapkričio 14, Worcester, Mass., pažangiosios lietuvių organizacijos gražiai atžymėjo 50 metų sukaktį rašytojavoimo ir organizavoimo darbų Simano Janulio, ir pagerbė jį patį.

Simanas dabar gyvena Worcestery. Jis ten darbuojasi mūsų organizacijose ir bendradarbiauja spaudai.

Savo ilgų metų darbą Simanas pradėjo dar būdamas berods Umerkergs gimnazijoje. Pirmieji jo darbų žygiai buvo už Lietuvos nepriklausomybę—tauting, religing laisve.

Pat pradžioje jo karjeros jam teko nukentėti fiziniškai. Jis gerokai ampuštas. Jis taigi turėjo sunkumo gimnaziją lankyti, nes buvo skaitomas neįtikimas, negeistas caro valdžiai žmogus.

Toliau Simanui teko pamatyti ne vienas carizmo kalėjimų, o pagalios ir Sibiras, kuris tuo laiku buvo rūšciau kaip kalėjimas.

Simanas Janulis veikė su Justinu Baltūsiu, kaip jis jau nurodė savo laisuke, nese-

Bendrai styginių instrumentų orkestras (jei ten yra ir smulki) visvien skambina, dūdinis orkestras (taip vadinamas klaidingai "be-nas") griežia, o simfoninis orkestras ir griežia. Nors ja-me yra ir skambinamų instrumentų (piano, harpinų instrumentų ir tt.)

Kalbant apie muziką, kaip žodis "kavalkas" neturi vietos bendrinėje naujovinėje kalboje. Vietoje jo Lietuvoje vartojamas išsireiškimas numeris. (Pav. orkestras griežė tris numerius iki pirmos pertraukos.)

Man smagu sveikinti jįs progą šios sukakties. Džiaugiuosi, kad jįs tiek didelio ir sunkaus darbo atliko. Asmeniskai jis man draugas nuo pirmo susitikimo.

Mes vilniečiai vis sveikinam Simaną Janulį progą 50 metų sukakties jo rašytojavoimo ir organizavoimo darbų.

Kada Mrs. Marsh pasakė savo vyrui, kuriam jau buvo sutikusi atiduoti persiklras, kad Mrs. Anderson jo atsižada, tas nuėjo į Grant Muhleirn (Andersonienės tėvas) namus ir nušovė Andersonienės vyrą Vernon ir tėvą, ir Andersonienė pasigrobė išsitempę į automo-

bilį ir išsivežė. Jam užėjus išsigerti kavos, Andersonienė gavo progą pabėgti.

Visas dalykas bus sprendžiamas prisaikintųjų teisėjų šio mėnesio 20 d. Andersonienė palikusi našlę, netekusi ir savo tėvo, dabar, sako, nenori daugiau matyti ir savo buvusio meilužio Glenn Marsh. Pastarasis bando paskandinti savo nuodėmes skaitant bibliją už groty sėdėdamas. Tai paskėmė neapsvarstytą dviejų žmonių gėlosio pasiduodant nesuvaldomai melei. Gaile mažų vaikučių abiejų šeimų. Jiems turbūt skaudžiausiai atsilieps ši baisi tragedija. Rockfordietė.

Sirdies liga stagiai ir netikėtai parbloškė užvakar lietuvių — Charles Shukį, gyvenusį ant 7139 So. Maplewood Ave., Marquette Parke.

Soviet Lithuania this past Friday, November 7, joined other republics of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in celebrating the 30th anniversary of the great October revolution which swept Czarism into oblivion.

Song and music greeted early risers in Vilnius, capital of Lithuania, and as people clad in their holiday best hurried through streets past buildings adorned with banners, portraits of government leaders, congratulations were exchanged with neighbors who headed toward appointed places where their columns were assembling in parade formation.

With bands and choral groups columns moved in the direction of Soviet Square where troops of the Vilnius garrison were lined up. Here

There is a strong possibility that Lithuanian-Americans will be subjected to newspaper stories which will be screaming about new "Communist plots" in the close future.

The headlines will be fat and big about how Attorney General Tom Clark has arrested this or that Communist leader on some trumped-up frame-up charge.

The Department of Justice and the FBI of J. Edgar Hoover have been busy as beavers behind the scenes working up big fat newspaper scare headlines.

This is timed with the coming special session of Congress which is going to try to knife the American people's demand for protection against high prices. They are going to stampee through a sinister and disgusting "revive-Germany" program which will be disguised as a "relief for Europe program."

In short, there is very dirty work afoot both in Congress and in London.

Washington's State Department needs a big noise, a hoopla scandal, a "spy scare" of some kind to divert the attention of the American public from an un-American alliance with reviving German fascism.

That's where the newspapers and the arrests of Communists comes in.

O. John Rogge, former Special Assistant to Attorney General Clark, has publicly stated that a recent New York newspapers "leaks" about a terr-r-r-ible "spy" expose have been planted as blackmail for indictments without evidence.

Rogge charges that a "Communist scare" is being

framed to affect the Nov. 25 London ministers conference.

If these charges are true, then the White House should hear from the entire progressive and labor movement. Government by scares, hobgoblins, hysteria, and planted frame-ups menaces the democratic liberty of every citizen.

It was so in the days of the infamous Palmer Raids (in which J. Edgar Hoover played a leading part.)

It was so in the days of the Hitler Reichstag Fire frame-up.

Earlier this year, negotiations over Germany were fogged by the whipped-up "Canadian spy scare" cases and the "Truman Doctrine" speech which came just when the ministers were meeting in Moscow.

Will this pattern be repeated for the London meeting and the special session?

Will Washington try to smash up the London conference with a framed "spy scare" and arrests of Communists?

Will Washington try to hide its revival of German reaction, its betrayal of the Roosevelt pledges for a de-Nazified Germany through a newspaper hysteria and frame-ups?

These are the questions which Vilnis English Section puts to Lith-Americans, to all progressive groups.

Now is the time to alert the democratic-minded groups of the country.

Will the White House deny these charges? Will it act to forestall the planned hysteria?

Or will it admit its complicity by its inaction?

land but it was perverted into a rally of warmongers.

There was no condemnation of Hitler, no mention of the fact that his nazis murdered over 6 million Polish citizens.

But there was praise of one of Hitler's stooges, Tiso of Slovakia, who was pictured by Editor Sciranka of Slovakia w Ameryke as a martyr who was hanged with the rosary in his hand and a prayer on his lips for the freedom of the Slovak and Polish people!

The Polish American congress claims that the meeting was a great success, that 5,000 persons enthusiastically acclaimed the speakers, etc.

In fact, the meeting was a flop. Altogether about 1,200 persons came — 700 Polish Americans and the rest Slovaks, Lithuanians and others. However, many in the audience were so disgusted that several hundred left before its conclusion.

Bit By "Red" Bug

CANADA NEWSPAPERS, OFFICIALS CONDEMN AMERICAN AUTHORITIES FOR INCARCERATION OF LITH CHORUS

Canada's Toronto Daily Star, Evening Telegram, Daily Tribune and Globe and Mail took to task American immigration authorities who on November 2 incarcerated for five hours without food, water, 45 members of the Toronto Lithuanian Bangos Chorus.

The group bound for a performance in Detroit, Michigan, were thrown behind bars and denied all civil liberties on the

grounds they were "communists". Among them were two children ages 10 and 11.

Canadian officials commenting on the action classified it as outrageous and insulting.

Writing in the Toronto Daily Star, correspondent Robert Neilsen categorized the incident as hysteria developed by reactionary political element. He classified the maneuver as a manifestation of "anti-communist hate" sweeping the United States as highlighted by the Un-American Activities Committee which is attempting to destroy every semblance of civil liberties.

A Canadian government official in Ottawa insisted there was no basic reason why the group had to be held at the border and put through hours of humiliation, in that the choral group represented no political party and had no idea of remaining as permanent guests in the United States.

Lithuanian organizations have forwarded protests to immigration officials responsible for the incident, while in Canada newspapers featured the comments of Regina Strash, chorus soloist who acted as spokesman for the Bangos Chorus.

INSIDE OUT

Here is the inside "Philadelphia story" on what happened in Independence Sq. Nov. 1 when a double handful of hoodlums tried to break up a rally sponsored by the Progressive Citizens of America.

Less than two hours before the meeting was scheduled to get under way, the U. S. circuit court upheld a district court order restraining the city from interfering with the meeting.

Originally it was planned to present some of the "unfriendly 19" Hollywood people whom the House Un-American committee has been trying to force to surrender their freedom of political conscience, which is guaranteed by the first amendment. But due to the uncertainty surrounding the meeting, they could not arrive in time.

The audience of over 2,000 was prevented from hearing the speakers by not more than 50 hecklers. When one woman cried, "Let them speak," she was knocked down and kicked.

Another was kicked in the shins for applauding the speakers and when she complained to the police they told her if she didn't like it she should go home.

The hoodlums precipitated a dozen or more fist fights and the police invariably carried away the victims rather than the assailants. With this sort of intimidation, the bulk of the crowd naturally was afraid to applaud. Flying wedges of hoodlums broke up groups who sympathized with free speech.

Hiler Youth, Not Vets

The daily papers have tried hard to make it appear that veterans broke up the meeting. But actually most of the noise and violence came from a gang of teen-age hoodlums who frequently gave Nazi salutes and shouted such things as:

"Ubangi!" "Go back to the ghetto!" "Gerald L. K. Smith will take care of you!" "We should have fought Russia instead of Germany!"

The hecklers were so anti-Semitic that they even shouted at a Jewish policeman: "We'll get you too!"

The booing began even while the national anthem was being sung, and a hail of flash bulbs, coins, stench bombs and wadded flaming newspapers was directed at all speakers.

Francis Fisher Kane, 81, white-haired former U. S. attorney of Philadelphia, stood silently for 15 minutes on the rostrum, vainly waiting for the heckling to subside. He retired only after his assistant's glasses had been broken and eye cut by a flying coin.

I spoke next, and managed to say a few words in defense of freedom on the site where two of my forebears happened to have signed the Declaration of Independence.

The papers, which ran advance scare headlines inspiring violence, are much to blame for the near-riot. They did not print until after the meeting a statement from the American Veterans Committee upholding free speech.

The real issue presecuted by this Philadelphia story is whether a precedent is to be established whereby inspired mob violence, abetted by the press and police, is to be allowed to contravene court decisions upholding the constitutional right to hold such

meetings.

One such incident leads to another. Already fascist-minded gangs have broken up Communist meetings, and now this PCA meeting in Philadelphia.

Union meetings may be next.

Putting Profits Before Safety Causes Crashes

CHICAGO—Neglect of union safety recommendations was behind the recent crash of a United Air Lines plane in Bryce Canyon, Utah, which took the lives of 52 persons, including two labor leaders, Pres. David L. Behnecke of the Air Line Pilots Assn. (AFL) charged here.

Behnecke said the crash might have been averted had an administrative setup existed to maintain safety recommendations repeatedly made by the AFL pilots.

"The records will bear out," he said, "that so far, on the scales of final determination, when it is a question of air safety versus money, obviously money has borne the greatest weight."

Just Between Us

• **Publicity:** The coming Eastern Seaboard LMS Festival, among other things, we hope, will emphasize the value of publicity. Too many of our groups are not publicity-conscious with the result that many opportunities which can be utilized to create good will and advertising are not being grabbed by us as they should be.

• And so, we must come to realize that in order to the cultural field. Without publicity, the whole thing is dead. Without publicity no one knows about it.

• And so, we must come to realize that in order to get as much success out of anything that we attempt, we should maintain good relations with the press, be it Lithuanian or American. We must learn to take advantage of every situation to get into the columns of the newspapers. But are we doing it?

• We can take the example of our own Lithuanian American newspapers, and we find that many of our cultural groups do not take advantage of the publicity they can get in into them. The editors may be hungry for their stories, for their correspondences, but if we do not get them in to the editors, we shall not see them published.

• The same thing is with the local American press. The local newspapers are just as anxious to get stuff published about your activities as the Lithuanian press. Each newspaper, of course, has certain rules and regulations with which you will have to comply, but if you do not even try, then you are not going to have very much success.

• Our idea of what should be released to the press is very simple. If it is worth doing, it is worth telling the world about. Our Lithuanian organizations have always been too modest when it comes to the American press. But we needn't be that way. We should go right ahead and establish relations with the local newspaper's city editor, with the local radio station's disc jockey, and regularly supply them with information to be published or broadcast.

It perhaps would be a good idea to have a couple of people in each community handle the publicity in the local press for all progressive Lithuanian organizations. In this way, we would be able to get a better "in."

• We just spoke to Tom Yermol, Tiesas's expert on sports and columnist, as to the prospects for the 1947 Lithuanian All America. Tom is very enthusiastic, but he has noted one thing—many Lithuanian American names do not sound Lithuanian American. And as we go on, we suspect this "Americanization" of names will continue. Although the fellows are registered in their respective colleges as Lithuanians, many of them are not widely known to be Lithians simply because their names are pronounced with ease by the radio announcers.

• This brought up another subject—how can you find football players of Lithuanian descent when their names do not sound Lithuanian at all? Well, Tom is of the opinion that all those who are interested in getting a really swell Lithuanian All America should show enough interest in the subject to write in about players on college football teams whom they know to be of Lithuanian descent. Otherwise, some of the best men may be overlooked. All that a fellow need do is jot down a name and college where the man plays and send it to Tiesas Sports Page, 419 Lorimer Street, Brooklyn 6, N. Y.

On Oct. 29 Pegler, who was attending the House un-American committee hearings in Washington, wrote that someone called at the committee's office "to try to arrange a 'fix' so that Louis B. Mayer (of MGM) would be excused from testifying . . ."

The gent who okay's Peg's paycheck, William Randolph Hearst, evidently disagreed with his pet hander, for as soon as he saw the column, he wrote an indignant letter, which the Hearst chain dutifully published.

Said Hearst: "Wednesday's paper carried an article from Washington implying that Mr. L. B. Mayer or his agent had been trying to 'fix' or influence the Congressional Committee investigating Communistic activities in Hollywood.

"The implication is unwarranted.

"Mr. Mayer was not trying to fix the committee or anything else."

Take your choice.

• Speaking of Pegler, a distasteful but often necessary chore for the purpose of this column, here's a typical example of his moral dishonesty.

In a series of recent columns he attempted to besmirch the memory of the late William E. Dodd, anti-fascist U. S. ambassador to Germany during the Hitler regime. Using a book by New York political boss Ed Flynn as his source, Pegler claimed that FDR never knew Dodd and had appointed him to the post by mistake.

Recently the press reported that Flynn was going to retract the slander that Dodd had been appointed by mistake. Flynn was forced to do this when Dodd's son and daughter came up with evidence that FDR and Dodd were in fact old acquaintances.

Flynn has withdrawn his slander, but mum's the word for old man Pegler.

• A flock of experts, including none other than Robert A. Taft, GOP contender for the Presidency, have been dashing around the country spreading the news that "the straw that breaks the camel's back on prices" is the food which the U. S. is sending overseas. Let's feast on these facts for a while, gathered from U. S. sources:

Exports of meat between May 1946 and May 1947 deprived each American of exactly 3.6 pounds a YEAR. BUT, during the same time the price of meat jumped 83 percent!

In that same period, only 4-10 of 1 percent of the total butter supply left the country. But the price increased 29 percent!

That list could go on and on. We've our own idea who's responsible for high prices, and those hogs swilling at the profit trough (and we mean Swift, Armour Cudahy, etc.) could also give you the answer—if they weren't hogs.

• Spearheading big business' attack on the 40-hour week, the U. S. Chamber of Commerce in an appeal for repeal of that federal provision argued Oct. 28: "There has been little evidence to show that if adult persons work more than 40 hours per week, they would impair their health, efficiency and general well-being."

That chamber claim is as phony as its claim that the Taft-Hartley law "emancipated" the American worker. A Labor Dept. study in July, based on industry-wide surveys, reported that in plants using the longer workweek "the additional output was so small as scarcely to warrant the additional time worked . . . Injuries also increased as hours increased . . . With a few exceptions the better efficiency during the shorter workweek was enough to offset the decrease in hours by one-third or one-half. The demonstrated superiority of the 5-day week was decided."

● For some time we've been trying to convince our young friends that a concert need not be a dry, boring affair. I doubt if we made much headway. But along comes the Sietyno Chorus of Newark, N. ● Before the Sietyno Chorus decided on this Night Club scene, they discussed the subject and were surprised to find that many other themes could have been worked up the same way. News From Illinois Employment Service

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ON SERVICE TO VETERANS

This is another in a series of questions and answers regarding the rights of ex-servicemen and their families, as answered by the Veterans Division, Illinois State Employment Service, 817 W. Exchange Avenue. For further information, contact that Division. In this series, the ISES attempts to answer questions most frequently asked by ex-servicemen and women.

Question: Is the service pay of the Army and Navy enlisted personnel exempt from Federal Income Tax?

Answer: Yes, Public Law 384 continues until January 1, 1948. This law exempts the service pay of Army and Navy enlisted personnel from Federal Income Taxes. It also exempts the first \$1500.00 of an officer's pay from income tax liability.

Question: Is a veteran who received a dishonorable discharge eligible for hospitalization in a Veterans' hospital?

Answer: No, unless he attained eligibility by reason of service prior to or subsequent to the service from which he was dishonorably discharged, he may not enter a Veterans' Hospital.

Question: Can a veteran have an X-ray made at the Veterans' Hospital to give to a personal physician?

Answer: No. Such an X-ray may not be taken out of a Veterans' Hospital.

Question: If a soldier is killed in action and has National Insurance, may his widow, if she is named beneficiary, collect this insurance, together with the regular widows' pension of \$50.00 per month?

Answer: Yes. If the widow is named beneficiary, she may collect this insurance, and may also receive the \$50.00 per month widows' pension.

Played by Jack Marcotti, regional head of the Intl. Union of Mine Mill and Smelter Workers, photographed by Sy Wexler, directed by H. Arthur Klein and narrated by Sid Danzils and Tom Holland, The People's Program tells of a GI who goes to the sources to find out labor's position in America today. Local CIO leaders explain their attitudes on various points and the floats illustrate their meaning, as the film unfolds into 22 minutes of top labor entertainment.

The imperfections of Klein's earlier Old Man Atom are almost all overcome here and the new film emerges as a must for labor, whether CIO, AFL or independent. We suggest you ask your union to book it—and many a club or civic organization will be better off for showing it to its members, too . . .
