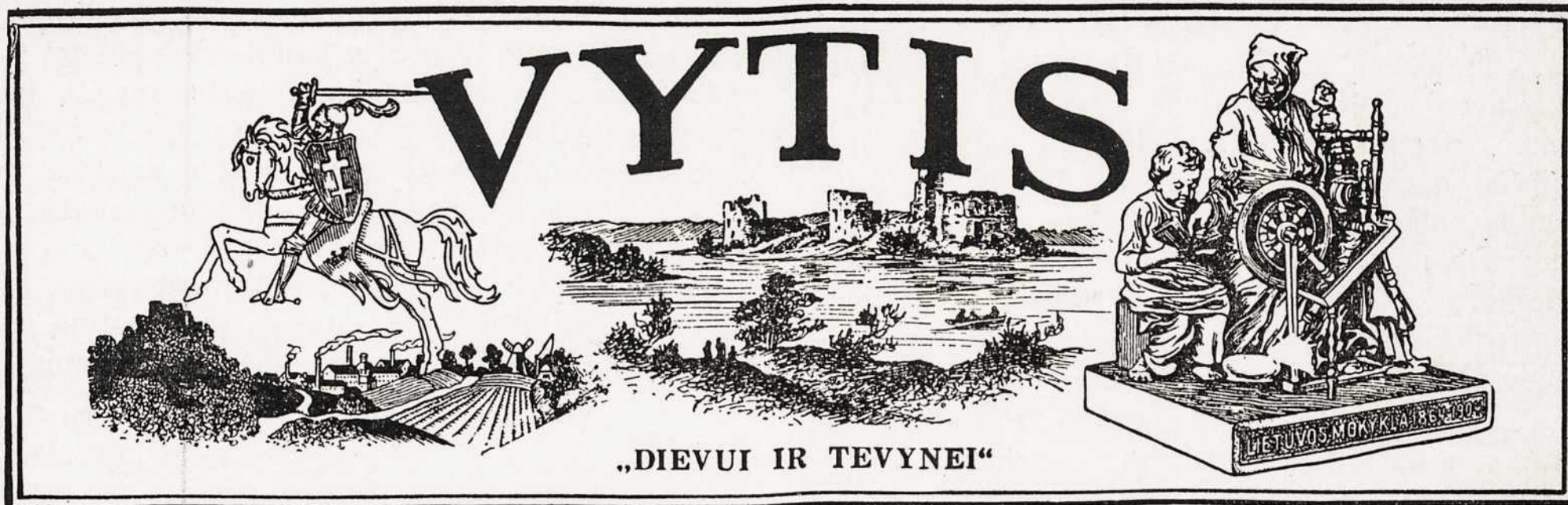

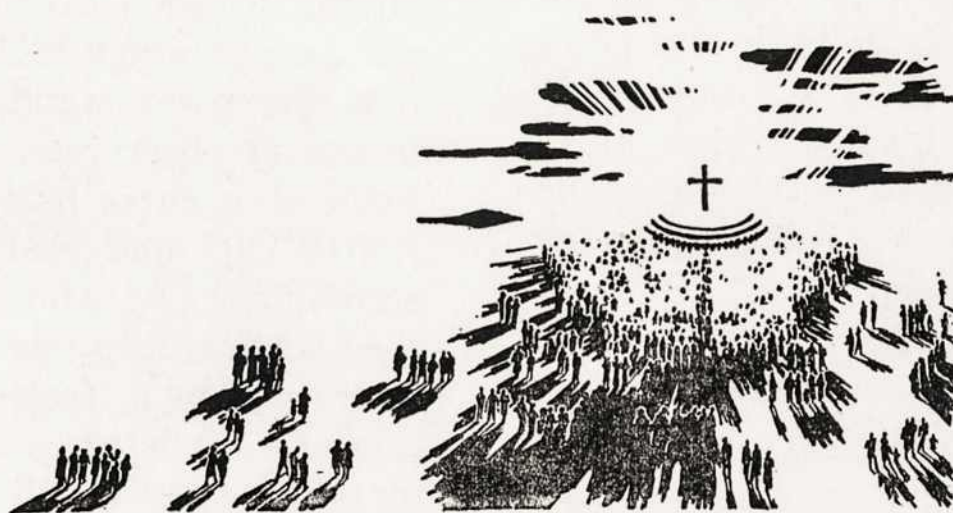

## ŠIŲ DIENŲ MINTYS

Tragiškas atsitikimas Klaipėdos krašto nuo Lietuvos suspaudė lietuvių širdį dideliu skausmu. Skaudžiausias dalykas, kad patys klaipėdiečiai daugumoj nepamylėjo Lietuvos: kaip sunus palaidunas, kaip neištikima moteris apleido savo namus, kad su svetimais sau laimes jieškotų. Lietuva bejėgė buvo tam atsitikimui pasipriešinti ir religinis lietuvis savo tik tikėjime jieško paguodos ir suraminimo.

Prisimena Šv. Rašto žodžiai: "Pas savuosius atėjo, ir savieji jo nepriėmė;" prisimena V. Jėzaus kančia ir prisikėlimas iš numirusių kaip pavyzdingas kelias per kentėjimus į pergalę. Vienok tais prisiminimais nevalia save apgaudinėti, nevalia perdrąsių palyginimų daryti: nes V. Jėzus buvo nekalčiausias ir galingiausias Dievas, mes gi tik neliuosi nuo kaltybių žmonės ir menki Dievo sutvėrimai ir V. Jėzus buvo nužudytas, Lietuva gi per Klaipėdos krašto praradimą tapo, tiesa, nuskriausta, sužeista, susilpninta, bet visgi nesunaikinta, visgi pasiliko gyva ir didesnė pagarboj tautų tarpe. Taigi netinka lyginti Lietuvos kančios su Kristaus kančia, tik reikėtų iš Kristaus kančios pasimokyti kantrybės, artimo meilės, pasiaukavimo ir pasišventimo dorybių.

Ne keršto, ne pagiežos pageidauti savo priešams, bet verčiau sakyti: Viešpatie, atleisk jiems, nes nežino, ką daro. Kad ir savo priešams nelinkėti to, ko patys sau nelinkėtumėm. Kovoti krikščioniškai: iš neprietelių stengkimės sau draugus padaryti. Jeigu neprivesim kitų, kas mus mylėtų; bet geras darbas galim ir aršiausio priešo suminkštyti širdį ir prie savęs patraukti. Kantrybė daug pergali; kantrybė viską pergali.

Tautų moralybė nesiskiria nuo asmenų moralybės. Kas negera žmogui tas negera ir visai tautai. Ko nevalia daryti vienam žmogui, to nevalia daryti ir visai tautai. Dievas baudžia žmogų už jo atskiras kaltybes, Dievas baudžia ir tautą už jos bendras kaltybes.

Kiekvienam tautiečiui turi rūpėti kad visa Tauta savo veikime Dievo įsakymų besilaikytų ir Dievo bijotų.

Kad ir visos kitos tautos nepaisytų Dievo, kad ir viduryje plešriųjų vilkų gyventumėm, mums nevalia ir neapsimoka mokytis nuo blogųjų jų blogybes, bet verčiau kantrybėj ir nekaltybėj laukti tolimesnio įvykių vystimosi ir su viltimi laukti gerumo pergalės. Ir ne tik laukti, bet savo geras darbas pagreitinti tos pergalės atėjimą!

Mat, jei kokia nors, — nauda yra tēmyti

tik kitų blogumus ir kaltybes; daug naudingiau yra tēmyti savo ir savųjų kaltybes; ir ne del to, kad saugoti Dievo nustoti savuosius mylėti, bet priešingai, kad iš meilės prie savųjų, pavojingus blogumus išrauti, prašalinti ir dangaus ir žemės akyse geresniame padėjime atsirasti, gražesnėj šviesoje pasirodyti.

Velykinių linkėjimų išreikšdami vieni kitiems ir sau patiems vis amžiną ir visuotiną gerumą turėkim mintyse. Ramybė teisi su mumis.

## LIETUVIŲ KALBA

In the last issue of the "Vytis" there was an article in the form of a letter addressed to all the Knights giving reasons why we of Lithuanian parentage MUST hold Lithuanian and all that the word stands for, in high esteem. A means of observing this precept, worded in the form of a curse by the prophet David, is by KNOWING and USING Lithuanian. Hence, to accomplish our aim this section "LIETUVIŲ KALBA" will appear as regularly as possible. There will be a treatise on the proper pronunciation of each letter, vowel and diphthong. Grammar and syntax will be explained and most of all a vocabulary of modern words and terms with their accent will be listed. It is no secret that this is our greatest need. We want to know the Lithuanian word for portable typewriter, subway, elevator, basket-ball and business terms, but our search always proves futile, because there is no such dictionary with these words. The writer does not claim to know all the words, but with well over twenty thousand index cards at his disposal, he feels he can be of great assistance to the Lithuanian-Americans, who wish to further their study of Lithuanian or wish to get a solid grip of the fundamentals of the Lithuanian Language.

It may be of interest to know that the writer began indexing Lithuanian words in 1929 as a pastime. However, from 1933 it was taken up seriously and is continued at a faster clip, because a young lad of 16, who has taken such an interest in the language, has been supplying the writer with 200 to 300 words every week. His younger brother averages slightly less. The writer types these words on index cards and files them.

Here is an example how the writer intends to proceed:

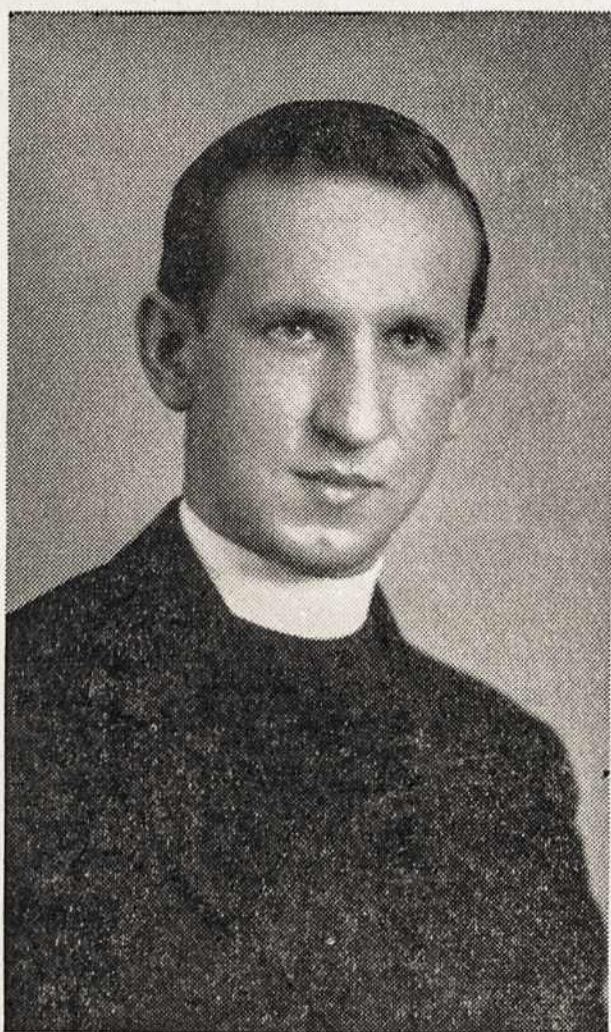
Iždo globėjas. Nors gyvena Kenoshoje, bet p. Stulgaitis lošia svarbią rolę Chicagos Apskričio veikime.

The music of the Solemn High Mass was sung by a choir of

eighty voices under the direction of Prof. Joseph Zilevičius. Assisting the celebrant, Father Dambrauskas, were Rev. Michael G. Kemezis, as deacon, and Rev. John Vasaliauskas who with Rev. Kemezis is assistant pastor of St. Peter and St. Paul's. Father Vasaliauskas will return shortly to his duties in Lithuania.

Rev. Joseph Simonaitis, pastor of the church, was archdeacon; Rev. James F. Weisbecker, chaplain of the Alexian Brothers Hospital, was master of ceremonies, and the sermon was preached by Rev. John Balkunas, of Maspeth, L. I.

Also seated within the sanctuary were Rev. Joseph Shestokas, of New York City; Rev. Alfonse Jagmans, D. D., of Marianapolis College at Thompson, Conn., and Rev. John Kinta, of Paterson.

Several brothers from the Alexian Brothers' Hospital and twenty-five nuns attended, the latter group including Sisters of Charity and members of the Order of St. Francis and the Benedictine Order.

Father Balkunas preached in the grace of God as manifested in one who dedicates his life to the priesthood, and he told of chief incidents

in the life of Father Dambrauskas, to whom he offered his congratulations on having attained a worthy goal.

The Knights of Lithuania have presented Rev. Joseph Dambrauskas, M. I. C. with a gift to mark his recent ordination to the priesthood at a meeting in Lithuanian Liberty Hall.

Father Dambrauskas was born in Elizabeth, N. J., November 15, 1913. His father, Joseph, died ten years ago, and a year later his mother, Amelia Dambrauskas, passed away. A brother, John, and a sister, Mrs. Edward Gardner, live in Linden, and a married brother, Frank, lives in Bayonne. The brothers and sister have been much interested in his studies and have helped him to his goal.

After graduation from the parochial school of St. Peter and St. Paul's Church, Rev. Dambrauskas continued his studies with the Marian Fathers at Hinsdale, Ill. He entered the novitiate in 1929 and a year later made his profession of vows. He concluded his four-year course at Marianapolis College at Thompson, Conn., in 1934, and returned to Hinsdale Seminary for his theological course.

**KUN. ANICETAS LINKUS**  
Šv. Petro ir Povylo parap.

Kunigas Anicetas M. Linkus gimė Lietuvoje. Jo tėvai, Kazimieras ir Konstancija gyveno ūkyje. Jaunutis Anicetas mokėsi prie slapta išlaikomo kaime lietuvių mokytojo.

1905 m. manydamas rasiąs daugiau progos siekti mokslo, o tuomi daugiau pasitarnauti savo tautai ir tėvynei, atvyko į šią laisvą Amerikos šalį.

Turėdamas norą mokytis, 1909 m. nuvyko į Valparaiso universitetą, kur tuolaiku jau geras burelis lietuvių mokėsi. Čia besimokant jam teko vadovauti lietuvių kalbos ir istorijos klasese. Nuo to laiko jau pradėjo rašyti į laikraščius; kartais rašydavo ir eiles.

1913 metais pakviestas nuvyko į Šv. Bedo kolegija tęsti savo mokslą ir duoti lietuvių kal-

boje pamokas. 1916 metais baigė kolegiją gaudamas aukso medalį.

Nuo 1916 metų iki 1919 m. ir nuo 1920 iki 1924 m. redagavo studentų mėnesinį laikraštį "Moksleivių" ir "Giedrą."

1917 m. Anicetas įstojo į Šv. Prokopijaus seminariją. Jam baigus filozofijos kurą, 1919 m. vėl pakviestas į Šv. Bedo seminariją teologijos kursų ir destyti lietuvių kalbą ir istoriją.

1922 metais Anicetas Linkus priėmė kunigystės Sakramentą ir buvo paskirtas eiti vikaro pareigas Šv. Antano lietuvių parapijoje, Cicero.

1928 metais kunigas Anicetas paskirtas vikaru Šv. Kryžiaus parapijoje, Chicago.

1932 m. J. E. Kardinolas Mundelein paskyrė kun. Anicetą eiti klebono pareigas, ŠŠ. Petro ir Povilo parapijoje, Chicagoje.

Nuo 1928 metų iki dabar, eina lietuvių kalbos ir istorijos mokytojo pareigas, prirengiamoje Quigley seminarijoje.

Jau dešimts metų Chicagos provincijos Lietuvių Kunigų susivienijimo eina sekretoriaus pareigas. Visados veikia lietuvių organizacijose.

Lietuvos vyriausybė už darbavimasi lietuviams ypač Amerikos išėivijoje, apdovanojo suteikdama kun. Anicetui Linkui III laipsnio Gedimino ordiną. Ordino įteikimo ir jo pagerbimo proga yra rengiamas bankietas Balandžio 16 d. 1939 Shoreland viešbutyje Grand Ballroom, 55 ir Outer Drive, Chicago, Ill.

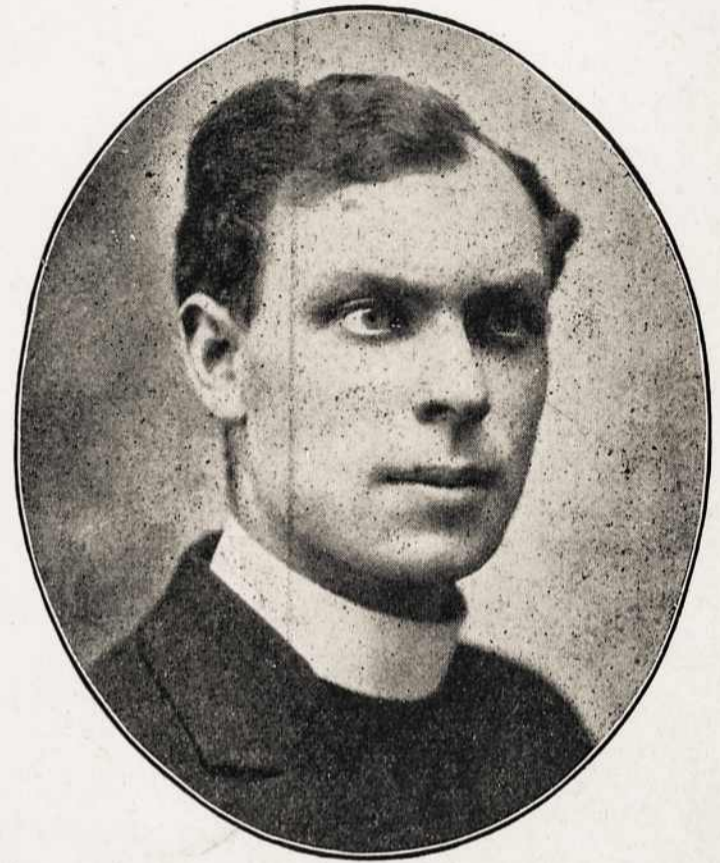
