Christmas... TRADITIONAL OR MODERN?

Increasingly over the past decade or so, whenever religious topics would be brought up for discussion; differences of opinion would be sure to arise on the basis of the traditional or modern outlook of the speakers. This confused state of affairs can be seen in discussions on moral issues, liturgical practises, Sacred Scripture and even in the understanding of Christmas.

There are those who proclaim: ,,Throw out the old. Let's go modern." The quick response to this is: ,

There are those who proclaim: "Throw out the old. Let's go modern." The quick response to this is: "Not so fast. The old ways are good enough for me." How does one choose? What are we to do?

It is clear that life goes on and must develop, as new things are invented and new ways of doing things are devised. We must not become stagnant, stuck in a rut. It is also eveident that just because a thing is old does not mean that it is thereby good and useful. Not every thing old is good; not every new thing is bad.

I recall reading about a priest who received hundreds of Christmas cards that were traditional. featuring the Christmas Child, Mary and Joseph, the angels and shepherds, the Wise Men. One card he received was NOT traditional. It was a picture of a dirty street in a poor ghetto, showing decrepit storefronts and half-burned-out and boarded up houses: "Christmas Greetings from the Ghetto." This card made the priest stop and think. This incident should make us think; also. Though not traditional, this card was meaningful. Christmas should come to the ghettos, too. Christ was born for all, especially for the poor.


As December 25th approaches, we think we know the meaning of Christmas. We strive to get into the spirit of the ancient or traditional Christmas. We are urged to relive the event that changed all human history.

However, to get to the heart of Christmas, there are obstacles to overcome, especially the modern crust of commercialism. I am sure that most people agree that Christmas carols blaring in department stores and in the streets of the city and the hectic sending of Christones cards and even the generous giving of gifts does not always touch the heart of Christmas, because these are merely material things. Christmas is a spiritual reality. Frequently these material things prevent us from knowing the true joys of Christmas itself.

Come to think of it, except for the angelic carol "Glory to God", we could probably do away with the rest and not destory in the least the spirit of Christmas.

At this point I can almost hear

Christmas season, and reaffirm our faith in His Holy Birth. May His true spirit abide with you through the Holy Season and for all time. someone say: "But... Christmas cards and Christmas presents do express the meaning of Christmas: God gave the Christ Child to the world, so we share our joy by greetings and gifts to family, relatives and friends."

How beautiful! But is it the real Christmas spirit that moves us? Isn't there sometimes a larger or smaller dose of superficiality, or slefishness mixed in? Do we remember to send a card or a present to the ghetto, to those who are really in need?

I am not advocating the abolition of Christmas cards and gifts. But I cannot push out of my mind the Christmas card from the ghetto.

Unless we are careful, we will be singing the wrong carols set to the wrong music and send out greetings to the wrong people and give presents only to those who need them least. If we do this, can we boast of possessing the Christmas spirit?

The problem with modernized Christmases is that in them we cannot see the simple mystery, because it has been so glamorized, twisted and overlaid with tawdry tinsel over the years.

How can we be led to the silence of the first Christmas through the din of twentieth century caroling? How can we appreciate the poverty of God made man, born of the Virgin Mary, when we are overly concerned with the material aspects of the Christmas holidays?

Let's find a place of silence and a place of emptiness: time to think about that once in all history happening: the Coming of God into the world as man. Let's find a place, alone, in the Presence of God to think about Christmas as God the Father would have us do.

Open your mind for a few moments to the thought that you are visible to God, even though He is not visible to you. Know that He sees you and is pleased to have you in His Presence.

Now, in silence and solitude ask

the question: Why, God? Why Christmas?

God's answer may come in many forms, but basically it will be under some aspect of His Love.

The Birth of Christ was the first moment of the reconciliation of humanity with the Father in Heaven. By the time Christ's work was ended, God's thinking, loving creatures on earth were no longer outcasts: they were made sons and daughters of a loving Father, wlecomed back into the family of God with a hearty embrace.

At Bethlehem there were no blaring trumpets, no gaudy, tinsel decorations. Only God, a Baby Boy who was God and His mother Mary and Joseph.

Why Christmas? To celebrate Emmanuel — "God-with-us".

What a difference there is between that Christmas and the 1979th!

Today, it's almost as if the world around us is trying its utmost to introduce a "God-is-NOT-with-us" holiday. Santas, Santas everywhere . . . a Christ Child only here and there!

These contrasts between the old, old Christmas and its modernized version came about, because the original Christmas came to be considered a merely human, historical event: Christ was born in Bethlehem. People failed to grasp the mystery that the Birth of Christ is an ongoing event. History can say nothing about this, but theology can.

The first Christmas, God fashioned a human body for His Son, as an instrument for the salvation of the world. Christ's life work, leading up to His death upon the cross, was to make it possible for all men and women who believe in Him and love Him to become instruments of God's Will, also.

Through Baptism each person is given a share in the divine life of Jesus, the life of grace, which is like a birth of Christ within the soul.

Baptism consecrates us as human instruments of divine activities, Christ-like actions. The other Sacraments perfect and transform us so that we can exclaim: I live, now not I, but Christ lives in me.

In our silence and solitude we have pondered many points. To conclude, let us take only one to stress and bear in mind.

Christmas is to celebrate Emmanuel, God-with-us.

This Christmas let's make an effort to personalize, to make that Emmanuel our very own: When we say Emmanuel, let's think: Godwith-me!

This will make it easier for us to become more perfect instruments of His Will in our own lives and in the lives of those around us. Saint Francis of Assissi's prayer shows us how:

"Lord Jesus, make me an instrument of your PEACE: where there is hatred, let me sow LOVE... where there is injury PARDON... where there is doubt FAITH... where there is despair HOPE... where there is darkness LIGHT... and where there is sadness JOY..."

Dievas sutvėrė žmogų amžinai laimei. Dovidas, kalbėdamas apie Dievo didybę ir žmogaus vertę sako: "Viešpatie, mūsų Viešpatie,. koks nuostabus yra tavo vardas visoje žemėje! kurs iškėlei savo didybę augščiau už dangų... Kai aš


žiūriu į tavo dangų, tavo pirštų darbą, į mėnulį ir į žvaigždes, kurias tu padarei; Kas gi yra žmogus, kad tu jį atsimeni? arba žmogaus sūnus, kad juo rūpinies? Tu padarei jį mažą ką mažesnį už angelus, garbe ir šlove apvainikavai jį" (Ps. 82-6). Pirmųjų tėvų nuodėmė žmogu atskyrė nuo amžinos laimės. Ir čia gerasis Dievas, pasigailėjęs žmonių, pažadėjo atsiųsti savo Sūnų. Patriarkai ir pranašai, kurie gerai suprato Dievo Rojuje žadėtąjį žmonijos Atpirkėją, laukė jo su neapsakomu pasiilgimu.



Jo laukė žydai ir pagonys. Kodėl taip visi jo laukė? "Kad suprastume Išganytojo būtinumą, turime dar pažvelgti nors bendrais bruožais į pagonų ir žydų tikybinio ir dorovinio gyvenimo būklę.

Juo tolyn, juo gilyn smigo pagonių tautos į moralinį skurdą. Išsilaisvinusios aistros nežinojo ribų. Apgedusi širdis nemokėjo branginti ir gerbti nė jokios dorybės. Protas

nebeatskyrė gero nuo pikto. Religija virto burtais. Vietoje Tvėrėjo imta garbinti sutvėrimai. Ištvirkimas buvo pasibaisėtinas. Dauguma suprato, kad jokia žemiška galybė jau nebepakels nupuolusios žmonijos. Net tokie kultūringi graikai ir romėnai nežinojo nelygstamo žmogaus vertingumo principo. Šeimos galva — tėvas turėjo neribotų teisių savo šeimos narių atžvilgiu. Su moteriške elgtasi, kaip su verge; jos būklė buvo nepakenčiama; ji neturėjo jokių teisių į savo vaikus. Vaikai buvo laikomi namų inventoriaus dalimi. Tėvas turėjo į juos mirties ir gyvybės teisę. Jis galėjo juos parduoti vergijon. Visuomenės santvarkoje niekas neginčijo vergu luomo reikalingumo. Apie du trečdaliu Romos gyventojų buvo vergai. Jie nebuvo laikomi civiliniais asmenimis. Jie neturėjo jokių teisių. Jie buvo tik priemonės ponų užgaidoms tenkinti. Jų savininkai galėjo juos kankinti, parduoti, užmušti. Į darba buvo žiūrima su panieka. Atenuose ir Romoje laisvas pilietis nedirbo. Jei turtingas buvo, darbus jam atlikdavo vergai; jei neturtingas, išlaikymo reikalaudavo iš valstybės. Artimo meilės nebuvo; turtuolių širdyse, vietoje artimo meilės, Holiday Creetings

liepsnojo aistrų ir godumo ugnis. Teisingumas nebuvo valstybinio ir visuoméninio gyvenimo norma. Ir gailestingumo principas buvo paneigtas. Tik pats Dievas tegalėjo pakeisti žemės veidą".

šv. Jonas sako, kad "Tuo Dievo meilė pasireiškė mumyse, jog Dievas siuntė savo viengimį Sūnų į pasaulį, kad mes būtumėm per jį gyvi. Tame yra meilė; ne kad mes mylėjome Dievą, bet kad jis pirmas mus mylėjo ir siuntė savo Sūnų, kaip permaldavimą už mūsų nuodėmes" (1 Jono 4, 9-10).

Angelai giedojo garbė Dievui aukštybėse ir skelbė didį džiaugsmą visai tautai, bet tik paprasti piemenėliai teišgirdo tą dangišką jį balsą. Pasirodė ant dangaus skaisti, šviesi žvaigždė, bet tik išminčiai tesuprato jos reikšmę. Ne veltui Evangelistas nusiskundžia: "Jis atėjo pas save, tačiau savieji jo nepriėmė. O kas jį priėmė, tiems jis davė galios būti Dievo vaikais" (Jono 1, 11-12).

Išganytojas atėjo nusižeminęs. Gimė paprastame tvartelyje. Dangaus ir žemės Valdovui gyvulių tvartelis buvo malonesnis už didžiūnų puošnius rūmus. Meilės, Tiesos ir Ramybės Kunigaikštis norėjo išgydyti žmonių puikybę, kūno ir sielos aistras, o širdis pakelti aukštyn prie Dievo.




"Piemenys sugrįžo atgal, garbindami ir šlovindami Dieva dėl viso, ką buvo girdėję ir matę, taip kaip jiems buvo sakyta", gi kiti kėsinosi jį nužudyti. Istorija kartojasi. Ir mūsų laikais vieni jį garbina, kiti ji persekioja. Kristaus persekiotojams galime pritaikinti Sauliui pasakytus Kristaus žodžius: "Sunku tau spardyti prieš akstina" (Apd. 8.5).

Kristus gimė kūdikiu, kad pašventinti kūdikius, patraukti juos prie savo dieviškos širdies. Gimė iš skaisčiosios Mergelės Marijos; augo ir stiprėjo šeimoje, kad tik įrodyti žmonėms šeimos garbingumą.

Visoms kartoms norėjo statyti pavyzdį šventosios Šeimynos. Nazarėte pasiliko klusnus Juozapui ir Marijai, kad duoti pavyzdį jaunimui gerbti savo tėvą ir motiną.

Tėvus ir motinas moko šventosios Šeimynos pavydžiu aukotis, kad tik apsaugotų ir išauklėtų jiems pavestą kūdikį. Kad apsaugotų Kūdikėlio gyvybę, jie keliauja į tolimą nežinomą kraštą. Neprašo stebuklo. Nugali visas kliūtis bei sunkenybes. Nerūgoja, neišmėtinėja. Ir sugriže iš Egypto i Nazareta tenkinasi paprastu nameliu be jokių patogumų.

Prieš apie porą tūkstančių metu Dievo Pasiuntinio tarti žodžiai: "Šiandien jums gimė Dovido mieste Išganytojas, kurs yra Kristus, Viešpats", tepripildo mūsų širdis džiaugsmu, Dievo meile, padėka ir pagarba. O jei savo širdyje turėsime paruošę jam buveinę, jis ateis pas mus Eucharistijoje ir suteiks mums dangišką ramybę.

A NEW ADDITION TO THE KENT STATE LITHUANIAN COLLECTION

The Lithuanian Collection at Kent State University has been greatly enriched by a current donation of over 150 books, various periodicals and a dozen maps, by Mr. Albertas Puskepalaitis of Boston. This collection focuses on Mazoji Lietuva and is very important to researchers interested in this area.


Mr. Puskepalaitis has been collecting material relating to Lithuania for over 50 years and his donation to the Lithuanian Collection reflects this life long pursuit. Even in his departure from Lithuania, Mr. Puskepalaitis managed to take along several boxes of books. Later he continued his pursuit, buying new and old Lithuanian books, some in German, relating to Mazoji Lietuva.

This extraordinary love for books manifested itself quite early in his personal and professional life. While in Kaunas he worked for printers of Sviesa and Varpas and participated in numerous activities pertaining to the printing of the written word.



Kiekviena kultūringa tauta ar valstybė turi metų kalendoriuje savo šventes bei nedarbo dienas. Vienos jų mini istorinio įvykio datas ar valstybės įžymaus asmens gimtadienį, kitos įprasmina tautos laimėjimus, mirusių pagerbimą ar padėką Dievui už derlių ir kt. Krikščionių tautos dar turi nuo seno Bažnyčioms joms skirtas tos šalies ar valstybės šventųjų globėjų šventes. Lietuviai, kaip sena ir nepriklausomai gyvenusi tauta, švenčia savo kraštui brangias bei svarbiais įvykiais atžymėtas dienas. Nepriklausomos Lietuvos metais svarbiausios tokių švenčių buvo vasario 16-ji — Lietuvos nepriklausomybės paskelbimo ir suvereninės valstybės atkurimo diena, kovo 4-ji — šv. Kazimiero Lietuvos globėjo diena ir rugsėjo 8-ji — tautos šventė primenanti Vytauto Didžiojo skirtą karaliumi vainikavimo dieną. Sovietų Rusijai okupavus Lietuva nė viena tų dienų neleidžiama švęsti. Negalima turėti net viešų pamaldų bažnyčiose. Vietoje tų istorinių švenčių pavergėjas ir vietos ateistai bando primesti mūsų krikščioniškai tautai svetimų minėjimų ir švenčių. Kas galėtų tautai daromą tą dvasinę skriaudą atsverti ir išlaikyti brangias tradicijas. Tai lietuvių tautos dalis gyvenanti laisvuose kraštuose. Visiems džiugu, kad išeiviai lietuviai, karo išblokšti ar gimę svetur, nepamiršo vasario 16-os šventės. Vienur ji minima prasmingiau — su pamaldomis, kitur pasitenkinama viešu susirinkimu, prakalbomis, kultūrine programa. Ne visu švenčiama Lietuvos globėjo šv. Kazimiero šventė ir rugsėjo 8-ji diena. O tos dvi šventės yra svarbios lietuvių tautai. Jų reikšmę supranta ir Lietuvos nepriklausomybės priešai. Carų valdymo laikais buvo net atimta iš lietuvių šv. Kazimiero bažnyčia Vilniuje, o šiandien pavergėjas ta Lietuvos globėjo šventovę yra pavertęs į ateistinį muziejų krikščionybės išniekinimui. Šv. Kazimiero relikvijos išneštos iš Vilniaus katedros į priemiesčio bažnyčią, o pati katedra išniekinta. P. Pijus XII šv. Kazimierą yra paskyręs lietuvių kilmės jaunimo ypatingu globėju visame pasaulyje. Tuo paskyrimu P. Pijus XII norėjo priminti lietuvių kilmės jaunimui nenutraukti dvasinių ryšių su to šventojo šalimi ir visada prisiminti savo lietuvišką kilmę bei savo globėjo šventą jaunystę.

Lietuvos žmonės negalėdami dabar minėti rugsėjo 8os, kaip Tautos šventės, tą dieną švenčia tik kaip bažnytinę — Šv. Marijos Mergelės gimimo dieną. Ta švente lietuviai mini ir Šv. Marijos Mergelės pasirodymą Šiluvoje ir per visą tos šventės oktavą gausiai plaukia į Šiluvą, nebodami trukdymų bei sunkenybių tą šventovę pasiekti.

Gyvenančių laisvame pasaulyje mūs niekas netrukdo ir nevaržo laisvai švęsti brangias mūsų tautai dienas. Šiuo laišku mes norime paraginti visus lietuvius iškilmingiau švęsti virš minėtas šventes su kiekvienai iš jų pritaikytomis pamaldomis. Ten, kur nėra lietuvio kunigo, kvieskite kitos tautos kunigą aukoti su jumis ta proga šv. mišių auką.

Daug kur, be virš minėtų švenčių, lietuviai dar mini birželio tragiškus trėmimus, tautos sukilimą prieš okupantus, Lietuvos kariuomenės ikurimo dieną. Tuose minėjimuose dera taip pat turėti ir religinę dalį. Labai sveikintinos mūsų organizacijos, Kongresų, susivažiavimų rengėjai, kad jie savo ruošiamų įvykių programose skiria ir pamaldoms tinkamą laiką. Kai mūsų Tėvynė išgyvena sunkius priespaudos metus, mes panaudokime visas progas maldauti Viešpatį jos žmonėms visokios pagalbos ir vergijos pabaigos. Lietuvių Katalikų Relginės Šalpos pastangomis yra siekiama įsipareigoti, kad kiekvieną metų dieną būtų meldžiamasi už Lietuvą. Visos lietuvių parapijos, vienuolynai, organizacijos yra įtrauktos į tą maldų vainiką. Kai kurios net svetimtaučių parapijos yra pasižadėjusios melstis už Lietuvą. Tuo būdu ir kitos tautos pradeda geriau pažinti mūsų krašto tragediją ir noriai įsijungia į mūsų maldų intencijas.

Visus kviesdami iškilmingiau švęsti lietuvių tautines šventes, į dažnesnes maldas už Lietuvą, šia proga norime nuoširdžiai padėkoti jums, lietuviai kunigai, už jūsų aukojimąsi mūsų tautiečių sielovadai ir už jūsų pastangas išlaikyti lietuvių išeiviją dvasiniai stiprią ir tautiniai atsparią. Tik dvasiniai tvirta ir moraliai sveika tauta yra pajėgi išlikti gyva ir kūribinga. To mes visi siekiame, tam tikslui dirbame ir tiems visų mūsų darbams prašome Dievo palaimos.
