

PRE-CONVENTION TOUR - Wednesday

We spent the day touring two areas important in Lithuanian-American history. We arrived at Marianapolis and were greeted by Fr. Bill Hayward. He told us some of the history of the Marian Fathers and of the original magnificent mansion which was destroyed by fire in 1946. Marianapolis is located on 300 wooded acres in the heart of historic Thompson. We walked the beautiful grounds and followed the path of the outdoor Way of the Cross.

We were impressed by the Marianapolis Preparatory School complex and the high standards they maintain in their curriculum. Founded in 1926 as a boys preparatory school until 1974 when girls were admitted. The average class size is 15 and the overall student-to-teacher ratio is 7:1. The faculty consists of 25 full and part-time members. All of the 1992 graduates were accepted by colleges.

In the Blessed George Chapel, we were thrilled to see one of the large oil paintings which hung at the Vatican on the occasion of the Beatification of Blessed George Matulaitis. After a few minutes of meditation, we left the chapel.

In the Dining Hall, we feasted on a meal especially prepared for us ... it was delicious. (Compliments to the Chef).

After lunch we boarded the buses and continued on to visit with the Sisters of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Putnam, CT. Upon our arrival, we were told that the Sisters were on retreat so we would have to be very quiet and could not speak with the nuns. We visited their museum which was filled with Lithuanian art and memorabilia. The K of L Archives room was open for our inspection.

The Sisters of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary was founded in 1918 in Lithuania by Archbishop George Matulaitis. In closing, I share this quote from "Spiritual Diary" of Archbishop George

Matulaitis: "As a child sleeps peacefully in its mother's arms, so let us undertake each task with even greater peace, knowing that we are always in the arms of God."

PRE-CONVENTION MARCH TO CITY HALL

With Mother Nature giving us an overcast morning, members and guests gathered together in front of the hotel at 10:45 a.m. Leading the march were four Lithuanian War Veterans as honor guard. They were followed by members carrying the Supreme Council and District flags. The closer the marchers got to City Hall, strains of marching music could be heard. As we awaited the Worcester's Mayor's arrival, marching and patriotic music continued to add to the mood of the occasion.

Eduardas Meilus, Jr. introduced Ruth Sarafinas, the national convention chair, who in turn introduced Mayor Levy. After the Mayor's kind words of greetings, Mayor Levy read the City of Worcester's proclamation designating the weekend of August 12 - 15, 1993 to the Knights of Lithuania. The ceremonies continued with the raising of the Lithuanian flag. All joined in the singing of the American and Lithuanian anthems.

From City Hall we walked to the Cathedral of St. Paul for the opening Mass. The Mass was celebrated by His Excellency Timothy J. Harrington, Bishop of Worcester. Assisting were Msgr. James Mongelluzzo, Revs. Joseph Anderlonis, John Petrauskas, Albert Contons, Albin Yankauskas and HM Albin Janiunas. Following Mass, buses drove the group back to the hotel.

FIRST PLENARY SESSION - Thursday:

Supreme Council officers processed into the meeting room preceded by the flags. National Anthem and Vyčių Hymnas were sung. Pres. Frances Petkus declared the 80th National Convention opened. National Spiritual Advisor, Rev. Joseph Anderlonis, opened the convention with prayer. Roll Call was made by 1st Vice Pres. Evelyn Ozelis. Rita Pinkus, president of host council welcomed delegates and guests and introduced Convention chair Ruth Sarafinas. Ruth gave a warm welcome and introduced Mayor Jordan Levy of Worcester. He stated his

grandparents came from Lithuania and felt he had close ties to the Lithuanian community. Ruth then thanked the Mayor and presented him with a copy of the Convention Logo.

Elsie Kosmisky, Amber District Pres. presented the nominees for the presidium: Chairs: Evelyn Ozelis, John Mickunas & Loretta Stukas; Secretaries: Mirga Bablin and Maryte Abbott; Parliamentarian: Peter Zansitis. Pres. Petkus gave a complete and concise State of the Organization Report.

Greetings were given by Rev. Albert Contons representing the Lithuanian Roman Catholic Priests League; Sister Eugenia Glinickas from the Sisters of Jesus Crucified of the Sorrowful Mother; Sister Lawrence of the Sisters of St. Casimir; Theresa Meilus, Bendruomene; Peter Molis of Lithuanian Scouts. Evelyn Ozelis read greetings from Bishop Baltakis, Lithuanian Roman Catholic Federation, Algis Taskunas from Tasmania, Australia and Lithuanian Roman Catholic Charities and Lithuanian Relief Fund.

Edward Baranauskas of C-100 Amsterdam gave a very interesting and informative talk on the 60th anniversary of the flight of Darius & Girenas.

Mandate Committee reported 230 attending with 210 voting at first session. Meeting was closed with prayer led by Fr. Anderlonis.

GET TOGETHER DINNER AT MAIRONIS PARK

SECOND PLENARY SESSION - Friday:

The session opened at 9 a.m. with prayer led by Fr. Joseph Anderlonis. Father then quoted Lenin, "Knowledge is Power". To Control the Mind is a Power Base. With this, he introduced Laura Maciuka of APPLE (American Professional Partnership for Lithuanian Education.) Laura is an educator and psychologist. In 1990 the grip on education from Moscow was loosened in Lithuania. The Ministry of Education and Culture did not know how to reform the system, how to bring psychology or counseling into schools. Vaiva Vebra & Jurate Krokys founded APPLE for this purpose in 1991 and invited 30 teachers and psychologists to teach the educators in Lithuania that summer. They conducted a two-week seminar and 500 to 600 teachers participated. APPLE asked for aid this past summer to help Lithuanian teachers attend the sessions as they could not afford the transportation to Vilnius, due to their very low income. Because of aid received, 800 were able to attend during the summer of 1992. Her excellent deliverance of the APPLE Project was received well by all in attendance

and a question and answer period followed.

Msgr. Algimantas Bartkus, Rector of Lithuanian Pontifical College in Rome gave an update on the college. He thanked all members who have supported the St. Casimir Guild and spoke of the importance of the college to the church in Lithuania. He also spoke of the importance of continuing support to the college by requesting Masses for the deceased which are held by all priests of the college, both retirees and students. He stated their vestments are very old and shabby and are in dire need of new ones. Anyone wishing to donate a vestment may do so through St. Casimir's Guild.

Greetings were again read and meeting adjourned with prayer led by Fr. Anderlonis.

THIRD PLENARY SESSION - Friday By Peter Zansitis

Rev. J. Anderlonis, spiritual adviser opened the session with prayer. HM Robert Boris, Pres. of Aid to Lithuania, Inc., presented a comprehensive report on the condition of the Fund. He discussed the K of L Pilgrimage to Lithuania in over 50 years. He displayed a special Lithuanian sash (jousta) that was being prepared for each pilgrim. Anyone at the convention who contributed \$100 to Aid to Lithuania was eligible to receive a sash.

A panel discussion ensued by Evelyn Ozelis, Loretta Stukas & Peter Zansitis on the proposed modifications to the K of L Constitution. Before discussion started, it was moved, seconded and approved that the discussion be

limited to 1-1/2 hours. Evelyn began the discussion by explaining the process the committee used to secure suggestions during the last two years. Many changes were cosmetic while others moved items from the constitution to the K of L Manual. Questions were solicited on each article. Loretta Stukas & Peter Zansitis continued the procedure article by article. At the end of the allocated time, discussion had not been completed on all articles. The convention then decided to continue this at a future session.

Elsie Kosmisky, president of Amber District presented the nominating committee list of proposed candidates for the Supreme Council for 1993-1994. The Resolutions and Greetings Committees then gave brief reports followed by the mandate committee. Rev. Anderlonis concluded the meeting with prayer.

CULTURAL EVENING - Friday Night: Bv Ed Meilus

After an intensive day of sessions, convention goers had the opportunity to travel, if only for a short while in their minds' eye, to Lithuania during Cultural Night. The evening included both audience participation and the chance to experience a montage of Lithuanian song and dance. Each seat had a sing-along sheet placed on it which included words to nine Lithuanian songs. MC Ed Meilus, Jr. welcomed everyone and donning his accordion invited all to sing in Lithuanian, Vilniaus Kalneliai, Ar Aš Tau Sesė Nesakiau and Kas Subatos Vakarėli. The Convention choir was in great voice, numbering about 400.

The second segment of the evening included the Lithuanian Folk Dance ensemble, Birželis, of Hartford, CT under the direction of Dalia Dzikas. The Echoes of Berželis (male dancers) under the direction of Jurgis Petkaitis ably sang several Lithuanian composers' works.

More audience participation followed. This time the sing-along featured, Buvo Gera Gaspadinė, Augo Kieme Klevelis, Plaukia Nemunėlis and Daug, Daug Dainėlių. The audience also had the opportunity to learn a contemporary Lithuanian song, Mažam Kambarėlį with the accordion accompaniment. The closing ceremony of cultural night embodied the warmth and camaraderie among K of L'rs. All stood up and cross-linked hands while singing, Lietuva Brangi. It was truly a memorable night.

FOURTH AND FIFTH PLENARY SESSIONS - Saturday:

With most of us conventioneers, I am sure, the last two sessions of the convention are the most popular. They condense all of the accomplishments of the year in a few hours.

Loretta Stukas, president of the K of L Foundation, Inc. reported that funds are growing but much more is needed. She stated the total has surpassed \$60,000. She also announced the 1993 Essay contest winners: First place award of \$300 went to Thomas Bruzga, C-86 DuBois, PA,; \$200 to Peter Jokubka of Chicago Srs.; \$100 to Mary Abbott of C-110 Maspeth, NY. Honorable mention went to Maryte Bizinkauskas of C-1 Brockton, MA and Joseph Kohanski, C-63 Lehigh Valley, PA.

Resolutions were submitted to send a donation to the recent flood victims, send a greeting to the Lithuanian government and give a second donation to Draugas, the Lithuanian press. These resolutions were defeated. Another resolution awarded \$1,000 to Lithuanian Childrens Relief, Inc. and \$500 to APPLE. Need for a larger archives room at Putnam, CT was discussed. It was suggested that money could be used from the Aleksis Estate and the room named "Marcella & Alexander Aleksis Memorial Room" Bob Boris spoke about the upcoming K of L Pilgrimage to Lithuania during the Pope's visit. A 10' cross will be erected on the Hill of Crosses.

After a lengthy discussion, a revised K of L Constitution was adopted by the membership Third Vice Pres. Rita Zakarka ushered in the Juniors. She explained what they were doing during the convention, especially preparing a humorous skit at the session which was enjoyed by all. Each Junior received a \$25 conventionship.

Second Vice Pres. Anne Cheplick announced the following results of the membership drive held from January 1 to June 30, 1993 in different categories: Brockton C-1 - 5 new members; Los Angeles C-133 - 87 new members; C-17 So. Boston - 15 new members; C-112 Chicago, IL - 19 new members. Individual awards went to Maryte Shalins, C-41

- 2 new members; Dorothy Banos, C-143 - 2 new members; Maryte Sepikas, C-133 - 84 new members; Al Akule, C-17 - 5 new members; Eleanor Kasputis, C-112 - 5 new members.

Nellie Romanas, ritual chair, announced that thirty recipients will receive their Fourth degrees on Sunday morning at Mass Lithuanian Catholic Religious Aid was sent a donation of \$1,000.

During the final session, a film maker from Lithuania, Aloyzas Buklys, filmed part of the session and the Supreme Council meeting. The film will be shown on Lithuanian TV - a first for the K of L A new Executive Board was elected which are listed on the front inside cover of VYTIS.

Peter Zansitis, Trustee, invited everyone to the 81st National Convention to be hosted by C-16 in Chicago the first week in August, 1994. Fr. Anderlonis closed the session with prayer and the participants all sang the three Anthems.

CONVENTION BANQUET - Saturday Evening: By Loretta Stukas

With the business of the 80th National Convention over, delegates and guests enjoyed pre-convention cocktails in the foyer of the ballroom or relaxed with friends in private area parties. The newly elected officers and committee chairs, plus honored head table guests and their spouses were feted by the Host Committee in preparation for the banquet.

Joseph Anderlonis opened the banquet with a prayer. MC Walinsky introduced the guests at the head table and all enjoyed the delicious dinner.

The formal program was begun with warm words of greeting on behalf of President of Host C-26 by HM Rita Pinkus. Newly elected Fran Petkus expressed her

promise that she will work providing them aid and love.



FRIEND OF LITHUANIA AWARD

Maria Tovares-Ashmanskas

There is an innocence in children that intensifies the drama of a tragedy: there is a vulnerability in children that deepens the trauma of an injury; and, there is a defenselessness that demands protection from those able to provide it. It would seem almost a universal imperative to give nurturing care to the young. I say almost universal because it has become abundantly clear that there are exceptions. There have been, and perhaps still are, societies where this human imperative is not operative. In those societies founded on the principles of socialized materialism and atheistic denials of the value of each human soul, we find a terrible aberration where the value of an individual is based on his or her productivity or potential for productivity. Their guiding principle was that old catch phrase - To each according to his contribution! In these societies, the orphan, who lacked a family to provide nurture through the developmental years, had to depend on the intentional disinterest of the state. Those unfortunates, with or without parents, that suffered physical or mental developmental impairments were in even a greater hazard.

Where there was minimal potential for a productive life, the society offered but minimal subsistence. The unfortunates were warehoused; put away out of sight and out of mind. Perhaps, it was undoubtedly hoped, they would die young and relieve society of further burdens.

Where you might ask could a society be so calloused, so uncaring, so inhumane. Sad to say, it was the society that covered much of the territory of the world and a majority of its population for over seven decades. It was called the Evil Empire; but little did anyone realize how evil it really was! And, unbelievably, it included the society of our beloved Tevynė during that terrible period when it was called the Lithuanian Soviet Socialist Republic.

The Evil Empire is dead, but the legacy remains. It is into this situation and this milieu, that our honoree as Friend of Lithuania, Maria Tovares-Ashmanskas came. She is married to a Lithuanian, thus the Lithuanian sounding surname. She was born of Latino-American heritage in San Antonio, Texas. Maria was raised in a west side barrio and knows from personal experience the

inner feelings of the disadvantaged. She knows of the trauma induced by being relegated to a sub-class of society because of factors well-beyond her control. She knows of the frustration of being denigrated for no other reason than cultural heritage. But she had the guts and the grit to bring herself out of these conditions and achieve a high level of success as linguist, translator and later lawyer.

A few years ago, many of us at a K of L National Convention saw a video tape that had been brought out of Lithuania about the orphanage at Akmene. We were shocked, sickened, even outraged by what had been documented on that tape. Most of us wrote our checks to SOS Vaikai and then returned to our normal affairs. Many did much more. They collected clothes and toys and durable goods that were later shipped to the orphanages. Note that I used the plural: they discovered that Akmene was not alone; there were other similar situations in Lithuania.

When Maria became aware of the plight of these disadvantaged Lithuanian children, she, too, was motivated to action but far above and beyond that taken by most, even the most dedicated, Lithuanian-Americans. This activity has led to her present position as the Vice-president and Director of Lithuanian Children's Relief, Inc. This organization evolved from SOS Vaikai. She undertook and succeeded in registering and attaining tax-exempt status for the organization. She is considered to

be a co-founder and driving force behind this group.

Traveling to Lithuania, she hand-delivered donated pediatric hearing aids and dental fillings for institutionalized children. She even hired a Lithuanian dentist to perform required dental work. She spent additional time in Lithuania assessing the additional specific needs of institutionalized children.

Perhaps the most dramatic of her accomplishments was arranging for corrective facial surgery for a young girl that she had met during the trip to Lithuania. The girl was brought to the U.S. for a series of operations that changed an ugly malformed visage into the appearance of a normal beautiful young woman. She inspired and motivated the American doctors that had been involved

in this surgery to organize a truly significant follow-up. A volunteer 18-member team of American medical professionals traveled to Lithuania and performed corrective facial surgery on 30 youngsters in January 1993. Maria assisted this further effort by assuming the logistical and administrative detail by arranging for transportation, lodging, visas and other clearances, etc. Without her efforts, the project might never have come about.

Additionally, she has assisted in making arrangements for shipping medicines, pediatric medical equipment and baby foods to Lithuania. Her efforts continue.

Thus it is with deep gratitude and admiration that we honor Maria Tovares-Ashmanskas as our Friend of Lithuania in this year of 1993.



KNIGHTS OF LITHUANIA 80th NATIONAL CONVENTION STATE OF THE ORGANIZATION REPORT

Presented by Frances R. Petkus, National President - August 12, 1993

In accordance with Article XI, Sec. 2 of the Knights of Lithuania Constitution, I hereby submit to the delegates of the 80th National Convention, the National Executive Board's annual report, wherein I have combined all reports submitted to me before the convention. It is important to note that this is but a summary of the work done by your Executive Board, to give you an idea of what we have achieved this past year and where and how our organization stands today. The officers have provided fuller reports of their activities in writing, and we urge you to take home a set of these reports, read them carefully, and share the contents with your council members.

SPIRITUAL ADVISOR

Rev. Joseph J. Anderlonis continues to be available for us when we need to turn to him for spiritual and moral guidance. Due to parish commitments, Father was only able to attend two of the Executive Board meetings this term. He continues to hold monthly Masses for the deceased members of the Knights of Lithuania. Father will be our spiritual leader when we embark on our pilgrimage to Lithuania in September.

PRESIDENT

The President organized and presided over four meetings of the Executive Board. The meetings were in Allentown, PA, Dayton, OH, Chicago, IL, Worcester, MA. Councils in each city made the Board feel welcomed and very much at home. Mail this year has been extremely heavy. Letters came from various cities in Lithuania, Australia, Liberia and all four corners of the U.S. The president has tried to stay on top of all requests regarding donations, information and general mail from the membership. The president, having received response from 80% of the councils regarding the Tax ID Information, has turned the material over to our legal advisor for final analysis. The survey requesting councils to review a copy of their council's VYTIS mailing list has been completed. Once again,

there was a response from 80% of the councils. We shall go back to the old system of having one person in charge of mailing. The councils must be thanked for their cooperation in helping to complete these projects.

We are still trying to locate Mr. Sergei Kovalev, recipient of the Fr. Jutt Friend of Lithuania Award. KNIGHTS OF LITHUANIA FOUNDATION, INC.





Amber District gathered together on June 13 in Philadelphia for the district meeting. C-3 Phila, were the hosts and provided a delicious luncheon for all attendees.



macology from Temple University. We're very proud of you, Daina, and wish you success with your State Boards and in all you do!


