### K of L Foundation 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize Winning Essay

#### What Should Councils Do to Get New Members?

I'm hearing so often that Knights of Lithuania Councils are closing because they cannot recruit new members – "Everyone is getting older!!!" When was the last time YOU asked ANYONE to join? Are you too timid to ask? In questioning people who might be interested in joining, the answer is, "Nobody has asked me."

Some worry about cliques... Now is the time to have a different approach to inviting new members. First, ask if they have ever been a K of L member. I contacted a person who belonged to the K of L 50 years ago. He came to a meeting and rejoined because he liked what he observed ... We don't want to hear that no one is interested in joining. Keep applications and brochures on your person to give to the candidate. There are many Lithuanians (or married to Lithuanians) looking for an organization to search for their roots and a desire to belong to a Lithuanian organization. Explain to the candidate that the K or L has contributed to USA and Lithuanian charities and offers Scholarships for all ages. We are encouraging Seminarians to become priests offering a scholarship. We by are instrumental in signing petitions for the entry of Lithuania to NATO and the European Union, etc.

Now, invite a prospective member as your guest to your next meeting to observe. Be there, welcome them with a big hug and thank you for coming. Notify the President to announce their name. Ask if they read the brochure. Introduce them to other members, so when they come to the next meeting they will know someone to talk to. Make sure they know of the next meeting. Some don't belong to the church to receive bulletins and are not yet on the telephone list. Don't rely on the sponsor to accept the candidate – you as a member should approach the candidate, introduce yourself and be friendly. During the social time, see that the prospective member is not alone. Strike up a conversation with them. When installed, present the candidate with a decal shield of the Vytis to put on their car. It identifies a Vycius.

Now, where do you find the candidates? At church, at the supermarket, church suppers, funeral receptions – just about everywhere. Ask if they are interested in the Knights of Lithuania.

Bringing in a new candidate is more than signing an application:: it is the entire council's job to nurture and guide and make him want to come to the next meeting.

**ASK** – You will be surprised how your Council will grow just by being nice!!

#### Lithuanian Affairs Update

#### Political News.

### 2004, A UNIQUE YEAR IN LITHUANIAN POLITICS

Lithuania became a member of NATO and the EUROPEAN UNION. The problems of the Presidency of Rolandas Paksas ended with his impeachment, and on July 12, 2004, Valdas Adamkus, the fourth President since the reestablishment of independence, took office for the second time. This ended the term of the acting President, Arturas Paulauskas. This also ended a political crisis that has faced Lithuania since October. 2003. Most Lithuanians saw his first term as relatively successful. One of the major challenges will be to integrate Lithuania into new political and economic structures that will make a significant improvement in the standard of living. In his inauguration speech, Adamkus said that his administration will play a more active role than he or previous presidents played before, while focusing more on domestic policy.

#### MOST LITHUANIAN PEOPLE FAVOR PRESIDENT – POLL

Lithuanian President, Valdas Adamkus, remains the best representative of people's interests and most favored politician in the country, several polls suggest. According to a survey conducted by the public opinion and market research center, Vilmorus, On September 9-12. 21.6 percent of the respondents see Adamkus as best representative of their interests. He is followed by the founder and leader of the populist Labor Party, Viktoras Uspakich (15.3%), Prime Minister, Algirdas Brazauskas (14.4%), ousted ex-president, Rolandas Paksas (10%) and MP Kazimira Prunskiene(9.3%), the poll shows. Among the best representatives of the people's interests are also Social Security and Labor Minister, (8.5%), Parliamentary Vilija Blinkeviciute Chairman, Arturas Paulauskas (7%), MP's Andrius Kubilius (6.8%) and Ceslovas Jursenas (6.6%) and Police Chief Vytautas Grigaravicius (3.7%). In another poll by Vilmorus, most respondents - 65.9% - indicated Grigaravicius as the most favored public figure.

### LABOR PARTY LEADS ALL PARTIES IN PARLIAMENTARY VOTE

On Sunday, October 10, 20 political parties and 1,253 candidates vied for places in the 141 seat Lithuanian Parliament. The Labor Party, a yearorganized **Russian-born** old party by businessman, Viktoras Uspaskich, did not succeed in winning an overwhelming majority in a new Lithuanian parliament. Results from 90 percent of 2,301 constituencies indicate that Labor received 29.44 % of the vote. Zenonas Vaigauskas, Lithuania's chief election officer, believes this may bring the party one-third of the parliamentary seats. In second place with 20.68 % of the votes, was the coalition of ruling Social Democrats and Social Liberals, "We work for Lithuania." Next was the Homeland's Union (Conservatives) with 13.89 percent of the vote. A new coalition, " For Order and Justice," founded by the dismissed president, Rolandas Paksas, followed with 11.66 percent.

#### LITHUANIAN PARLIAMENT PANELS APPROVE BID TO EXTEND PRESENCE OF TROOPS IN MISSIONS

The Lithuanian Parliament's committees of National Security and Defense, and Foreign Affairs have approved the proposal from President Valdas Adamkus, to extend the participation of Lithuanian troops in international peace-keeping missions until the end of 2005. The draft resolution, which is yet to receive a go-ahead from the Parliament, stipulates sending up to 140 troops and civilians to the Balkan region, up to 120 to Persian Gulf region, and up to 70 to Central and Southern Asia. The Parliament had returned the draft for revision earlier, as it had stipulated an overall number of troops to be dispatched to missions. About 200 Lithuanian troops currently serve in international peace-keeping missions in Iraq, Afghanistan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Kosovo province (Serbia and Montenegro) and Georgia. The proposed resolution suggests that Lithuania's military units currently taking part in foreign missions can be transferred to the control of the UN, NATO or EU members without a separate approval.

#### SAFETY LICENSE OF INGNALINA'S UNIT 2 EXTENDED

On September 15, the Lithuanian State Nuclear Safety Inspection (VATESI) decided to issue a longterm operating license to power unit two of the Ignalina Nuclear Power Plant (INPP). VATESI said in a statement that this decision followed a comprehensive assessment of safety at the reactor block in line with international practice and traditions, and was taken in consideration of the opinion from the Environment Ministry and the Radi ation Protection Center. VATESI said the assessment had verified that the plant's power unit two, was complying with the established nuclear safety requirements. "The long-term license authorizes (the plant) to operate the reactor block for several years," said Diana Medeliene, VATESI public relations officer. Ignalina's power unit one obtained a long-term operating license from VATESI on July 22, but Lithuania intends to shut down this reactor block at the end of this year, in compliance with its commitments to the EU. The entire plant is due to be closed down in 2009 if the EU provides adequate funding for the decommissioning process.

#### LITHUANIA AND ESTONIA TO RUSSIA:

It's you who owe us. "It is unfair from Russia to submit such claims. I think it is a political propaganda," said Estonian President Arnold Ruutel about the debt Russia claims Estonia owes, during a new conference in Vilnius on Monday, Oct. 4th. Lithuanian President, Valdas Adamkus emphasized that the Baltic states could make claims that Russia owed them considerably bigger sums for damage done during the years of the Soviet occupation. "If someone was to make a claim over paying the debts, it would be Lithuania, without any doubt, since it might ask to pay the bill for the entire occupation period," Adamkus said. Last week the Russian Account Chamber issued a statement saying that Baltic states' share of the USSR's liabilities that the Russian Federation assumed as external debt stands at USD 3.06 billion. This sum is estimated by the Bank of Russia.

#### **II. ECONOMIC NEWS**

#### LITHUANIAN INDUSTRIAL SALES INDUSTRY GROWS 13%

Lithuanian industry grew by 13.1% in the first eight months of 2004, compared with the same period in 2003, the country's Statistics Department has reported. Industrial production, measured by sales, edged up by 0.3% in August from July. The year-on-year growth rate was 4.3% last month. Excluding oil products, overall industrial sales increased by 8.2% in the eight months, compared with the same period a year ago. In August, sales were up by 4.7% year-on-year and 1.2% monthon-month.

### LITHUANIAN MUSHROOMS DEMANDED AT WESTERN MARKET

Mushrooms picked in the forests of Lithuania are on sale in German supermarkets, French open markets, Russian and American restaurants and even Mongolia. Fourteen companies in Lithuania are engaged in the mushroom export and import business, giving jobs to several thousand people. Lithuanians, who are sometimes called the Lords of Mushrooms, are facing strong competition from rivals in Poland, Russia, Turkey and Romania. "It is our reputation for quality and reliability that gives us an advantage in the fierce competition. Buyers in the West have such confidence in Lithuanian mushroom processors, that they buy our production without checking it," said Algimantas Brazionis, Director of Melynoji Uoga, a forest berry and mushroom exporter. The export of fresh, frozen, salted and dried mushrooms has doubled this year and could grow even faster. Experts estimate, that around 16,000 tons of mushrooms can be harvested in the forests of Lithuania annually. According to the data from the Customs Department, Lithuania exported about 2,500 tons of mushrooms and mushroom products worth a total of 30m litas last year.

#### AGING LITHUANIAN FARMERS

Statistics Lithuania reported that more than half of the 520,000 Lithuanians engaged in agriculture are people over 50 years of age. Most (58%) are small farmers, working small farms of up to five hectares. One-third of the country's farmers have farms of 5 to 20 hectares. Women comprise 53 percent of farmers and farm-related workers.

#### **III. MISCELLANEOUS NEWS**

#### LITHUANIAN ATHLETES' FINAL RESULTS of ATHENS 2004 OLYMPICS

#### EARTHQUAKE IN THE BALTICS

On Sept. 21, at 4:39 p.m., two earthquake tremors originating from the epicenter of Kaliningrad were felt in every Baltic state. The tremors registered 5.3 on the Richter scale in Kaliningrad and closer to 3 in Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania.

#### VILNIUS UNIVERSITY COMMEMORATES 425TH ANNIVERSARY

On September 16<sup>th</sup>, Foreign Minister, Antanas Valionis congratulated Vilnius University community on the 425<sup>th</sup> anniversary. According to the Minister, 425 years is a long and significant period not only in the University's, but also in the Lithuanian state's life. "It is symbolic that you celebrate this jubilee in the first year of Lithuania as a full fledged member of the EU. For many years, members of your University's academic community were actively building bridges from Lithuania to the EU," said the Minister in the letter of greetings. According to Antanas Valionis, by the efforts of Vilnius University Europe also was brought closer to Lithuanian science, culture, history and politics.

### NAZI HUNTERS RECOGNIZE LITHUANIA'S ACHIEVEMENTS

The Nazi-hunting Simon Wiesenthal Center has ranked Lithuania in a small group of countries which have achieved good results in the solving of Nazi war crimes and punishing those guilty. In the center's annual report that divides countries into six categories, Lithuania is grouped in the third category (C) together with Austria, Italy, Latvia and Poland. This category includes states which have made an advance in the investigation of the cases or have launched new investigations.



Our regular meeting was held on Oct 3, 2004. Pres. Frank Kwader conducted the meeting and then we had election of


officers for the 2004-2005 year. Congratulations to the new officers. May they have a prosperous year.


